QUESTIONS FROM ELECTORS UNDER PROCEDURE RULE 9

1. From Mr Kevin Barry to Councillor Strutton

“With a simple yes or no response, does Cllr Strutton believe councillors elected to Slough Borough Council should only serve the people of Slough?”

2. From Mr Gordon Moffatt to Councillor Swindlehurst

“Langley War Memorial Field (Charity 1055955) was paid for by public subscription and has been owned by the public since 1920. You sit both as a locally elected Slough Borough Councillor [The Leader] and also as a Trustee involved in the affairs of the aforementioned charity. Given the obvious need for openness and transparency whilst undertaking both roles, it is my belief and understanding that you have so far failed to publish any documentation, including agendas and minutes of meetings, which should rightfully be in the public domain, and the public have yet to be permitted to attend any meetings. When will you provide full disclosure and transparency by publishing all documentation relating to the involvement and activities of Slough Borough Councillors, yourself included, who simultaneously undertake such roles, both as an elected councillor and trustee, in this, and all other similar councillor-charity-trustee relationships throughout the Borough of Slough, why have you failed yet to do so, and when will all such meetings be open to the public and scrutiny, as they rightfully should be?”

3. From Ms Christine Bamigbola to Councillor Anderson

“The road expansion of High Street Langley comes with the loss of part of the Langley Memorial grounds, the potential demolition of homes (as is clear to see in the design and current pictures of the works) and six months of daily gridlocked traffic in Langley, can the Council tell me as a resident, whether consultation with residents of all Langley was carried out for this road expansion? When and how this consultation was done and the outcome of it?”

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
