

PART 1

27. Declarations of Interest

None were received.

28. Minutes of the Meetings held on 13th October, 31st October and 9th November 2011

The minutes of the meetings held on 13th October, 31st October and 9th November 2011 were approved as a correct record.

29. Application for Street Trading Consent - Go-Go'z Kebabs, High Street, Slough

The Chair welcomed all parties to the meeting and outlined the procedure for the hearing. It was confirmed that all parties had received a copy of the relevant paperwork.

Introduction by the Licensing Officer.

Mrs Rumney, Senior Licensing Officer, stated that Slough High Street was limited to five street trading sites and earlier in the year one of the sites had become vacant. The matter had been brought to the Sub-Committee as this was a prime location for street trading and it was felt necessary that the matter be determined by Members.

An application had been submitted by Mr Choudhry for street trading consent for Go-Go'z Kebabs in the High Street. It was noted that the hours of trading were Monday to Sunday 9am to 4pm. Although there was no statutory requirement to do so, the current street trading consent holders in the High Street were informed of the application. An objection to the application had been received from Mr Vella, who operated Vella's Burger Van at one of the sites in the High Street.

It was noted that should the application be granted, the Council's standard conditions would apply and any other conditions the Sub-Committee considered to be appropriate. Options available were outlined and Members were reminded that the Council was under no statutory duty to grant a Street Trading Consent and that there was no right of appeal against the Council's decision.

Questions to Licensing Officer

In response to the type of activity that had taken place at the now vacant site on the High Street, Members were informed that the pitch had been a flower stall.

Applicant's Representations

Mr Choudhry stated that having conducted research on the high street with regards to what individuals would like it was apparent that there was a demand for the type of business that was being proposed. It was submitted that there was a demand for halal food and that this business would not necessarily affect the existing street traders on the High Street.

Questions to Applicant

Mr Choudhry explained that he had conducted his market research on a busy Saturday afternoon and the type of food that would be offered included kebabs, chicken skewers and rice dishes.

Representations by Objector

Mr Vella, owner of Vella's Burger Van stated that he had been operating his business on the High Street for over 30 years and had diversified to cater for the needs of the market. It was submitted that given the tough economic climate it would be financially detrimental to him if consent were given for a similar business to operate on the High Street.

Summing Up

All parties were given an opportunity to provide a summary.

It was explained that the matter would not be determined until all applications for a street trading consent had been considered by the Sub-Committee and that the decision would be communicated in writing within three working days. Alternatively, contact could be made with the Democratic Services Officer the following day.

Decision.

Resolved – That the application for street trading consent be refused. In reaching their decision, Members were of the view that the type of trading detailed in the application was not suitable for the High Street.

30. Application for Street Trading Consent - Soft Ice, High Street, Slough

The Chair welcomed all parties to the meeting and outlined the procedure for the hearing. It was confirmed that all parties had received a copy of the relevant paperwork.

Licensing Sub-Committee - 15.12.11

Introduction by the Licensing Officer.

Mrs Rumney, Senior Licensing Officer, stated that Slough High Street was limited to five street trading sites and earlier in the year one of the sites had become vacant. The matter had been brought to the Sub-Committee as this was a prime location for street trading and it was felt necessary that the matter be determined by Members.

An application had been submitted by Miss Khomsi for street trading consent for Soft Ice in the High Street. The hours of trading were specified as:

- Monday to Friday 9am to 6pm.
- Saturday – 9am to 7pm
- Sunday 9am to 5pm
- Seasonal Variations: Christmas – 9am to 8pm/9pm
Summer Holidays – 9am to 8pm/9pm

Although there was no statutory requirement to do so, the current street trading consent holders in the High Street were informed of the application. An objection to the application had been received from Mr Vella, who operated Vella's Burger Van at one of the sites in the High Street.

It was noted that should the application be granted, the Council's standard conditions would apply and any other conditions the Sub-Committee considered to be appropriate. Options available were outlined and Members were reminded that the Council was under no statutory duty to grant a Street Trading Consent and that there was no right of appeal against the Council's decision.

Questions to Licensing Officer

None.

Applicant's Representations

Mr Chirisa, on behalf on Miss Khomsi stated that the type of business being proposed included a range of food from paninis', crepes, salads, baguettes and smoothies. It was explained that the business would encourage healthy eating and that the applicant had experience of working in the catering industry.

Questions to Applicant's Representative

Mr Chirisa stated that there was no intention of selling kebabs and that the focus was on promoting healthy eating.

Representations by Objector

Mr Vella, owner of Vella's Burger Van stated that he had been operating his business on the High Street for over 30 years and had diversified to cater for

the needs of the market. It was submitted that given the tough economic climate it would be financially detrimental to him if consent were given for a similar business to operate on the High Street.

Summing Up

All parties were given an opportunity to provide a summary.

It was explained that the matter would not be determined until all applications for a street trading consent had been considered by the Sub-Committee and that the decision would be communicated in writing within three working days. Alternatively, contact could be made with the Democratic Services Officer the following day.

Decision.

Resolved – That the application for street trading consent be refused. In reaching their decision, Members were of the view that the type of trading detailed in the application was not suitable for the High Street.

31. **Application for Street Trading Consent - Bua Thai Restaurant, High Street, Slough**

Prior to commencement of the hearing, the Licensing Officer informed the Sub-Committee that the Applicant had indicated that he would not be attending the hearing and for the matter to be determined in his absence.

Introduction by the Licensing Officer.

Mrs Rumney, Senior Licensing Officer, stated that Slough High Street was limited to five street trading sites and earlier in the year one of the sites had become vacant. The matter had been brought to the Sub-Committee as this was a prime location for street trading and it was felt necessary that the matter be determined by Members.

An application had been submitted by Mr Chinprasert for street trading consent for Bua Thai Restaurant in the High Street. The hours of trading were specified as Monday to Saturday 10am to 5pm.

Although there was no statutory requirement to do so, the current street trading consent holders in the High Street were informed of the application. An objection to the application had been received from Mr Vella, who operated Vella's Burger Van at one of the sites in the High Street.

It was noted that should the application be granted, the Council's standard conditions would apply and any other conditions the Sub-Committee considered to be appropriate. Options available were outlined and Members were reminded that the Council was under no statutory duty to grant a Street Trading Consent and that there was no right of appeal against the Council's decision.

Questions to Licensing Officer

None.

Applicant's Representations

The written application submitted by the applicant was considered by Members.

Representations by Objector

Mr Vella, owner of Vella's Burger Van stated that he had been operating his business on the High Street for over 30 years and had diversified to cater for the needs of the market. It was submitted that given the tough economic climate it would be financially detrimental to him if consent were given for a similar business to operate on the High Street.

Summing Up

All parties were given an opportunity to provide a summary.

Decision

Resolved – That the application for street trading consent be refused. In reaching their decision, Members were of the view that the type of trading detailed in the application was not suitable for the High Street.

32. Exclusion of the Press and Public

Resolved – That the press and public be excluded from the remainder of the meeting as the items to be considered contain exempt information relating to individuals as defined in Paragraph 1 of Part I of Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972 (as amended).

33. Private Hire Driver Conduct Hearing (Reference 02-11)

All parties were welcomed to the meeting, including a translator to assist the Appellant. The procedure for the hearing was explained and it was confirmed that all parties had received a copy of the paperwork.

In introducing the report, Assistant Licensing Officer, Mrs Sagar reminded Members that the matter had been adjourned from September 2011 as the Appellant had notified Democratic Services that he was abroad.

Mrs Sagar stated that the Appellant was arrested for the offence of soliciting in February 2011. In May 2011, a renewal application was completed and the Appellant failed to declare that he had been arrested and was on bail pending

a court appearance. Licensing Officers became aware of the Appellant's conviction following a newspaper article on the 24th June 2011.

It was brought to Members' attention that the Policy and Guidance on Convictions and Cautions stated that a serious view be taken regarding offences involving indecency and that applications would not be considered until a period of 3 years free of conviction or caution was shown.

Options available to the Sub-Committee were highlighted for Members consideration.

A Member sought clarification as to whether the Appellant had informed Licensing Officers of his conviction. It was explained that the appellant had been due to attend the Licensing Office on the 24th June and when the matter was put to him, he confirmed that he had been convicted for soliciting on the 22nd June 2011.

The Appellant explained the circumstances regarding his arrest and subsequent conviction for soliciting. It was submitted that he needed his private hire driver licence for financial reasons. The Appellant stated that his understanding was that there was no need to inform the Licensing Office until after he had been convicted and that he had been called into the Licensing Office before he had had an opportunity to inform them.

Representations on behalf of the Appellant were made to the Sub-Committee by a friend who stated that he had known him for more than twelve years. It was submitted that the Appellant had already been punished through the courts.

Members asked a number of questions regarding the incident for clarification. The Appellant stated that the renewal application form had been completed by his wife.

In summing up, the Licensing Officer reminded Members that they had to determine whether the Appellant was a fit and proper person to continue to hold a Private Hire Driver's Licence. The Appellant requested that he be given an opportunity to prove himself and in these uncertain economic times he needed his private hire driver's licence.

Decision.

Having carefully considered all the written information and submissions made at the hearing, the Sub-Committee

Resolved – That Appellant 02-11's Private Hire Driver licence be revoked immediately under Section 61 (2B) of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976.

34. Private Hire Driver Application Hearing (Reference 04-11)

Members were informed that no contact had been made by Appellant 04-11 as to whether he would be attending the meeting. Members agreed to defer consideration of the matter on this occasion.

Resolved – That consideration of Private Hire Driver Application Hearing (04-11) be adjourned.

35. Private Hire Driver Conduct Hearing (Reference 05-11)

The Chair welcomed all parties to the meeting and explained the procedure for the hearing. It was confirmed with all parties that they had received a copy of the paperwork, including the additional letter submitted by the Appellant.

Mrs Sagar, Assistant Licensing Officer, stated that the matter has been submitted to the Sub-Committee to consider whether the appellant was a fit and proper person to continue to hold a private hire driver's licence.

On the 6th October 2011 the Licensing Officer received notification from the Metropolitan Police that the Appellant had been cautioned for theft in June 2011. It was noted that the Appellant had failed to inform the Licensing Office of his caution within seven days in accordance with the Council's Policy and Guidance on Convictions and Cautions.

Mrs Sagar outlined that the policy also stated that a serious view be taken of any conviction or caution involving dishonesty, as drivers were in a position of trust having to regularly work with vulnerable members of the community. Options available were highlighted for Members consideration.

The Licensing Officer confirmed that the Appellant had held a private hire driver's licence since 2004 and that there were no other incidents on file.

Appellant Reference 05-11 submitted that he had made an error of judgement and regretted his actions. In addition, it was noted that he had been a licensed driver since 2004 and there were no other incidents regarding his conduct as a private hire driver.

A Member asked whether he was aware of the requirement to inform the licensing office of his caution within seven days of receiving it. The Appellant confirmed that although he was aware of his responsibility to have informed the Licensing office he had forgotten to do so.

Both parties were given the opportunity to provide a summary, following which they left the meeting to allow the Sub-Committee to deliberate.

Having carefully considered all the information available the Sub-Committee:

Resolved – That Appellant Reference 05-11's Private Hire Driver Licence be suspended for a period of six weeks and six penalty points be added to his Private Hire Driver's licence.

Review of Premises Licence – **Number PL007365**
Application made by Thames Valley Police

1. CURRENT POSITION

- 1.1 100 Lounge operates under a Premises Licence number **PL007365** which is held by a company called 100 Lounge Ltd at 100 High Street, Slough, SL1 1HI. The named directors of 100 Lounge Ltd are Mr Imran Hafeez and Mr Jagdeep Singh, whose correct name is in fact Mr Jagdeep Singh Phull.
- 1.2 The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) at the time of this Review Application being made by Thames Valley Police is Mr Sandeep Sharma who holds a Personal Licence number **PA007709** with Slough Borough Council.
- 1.3 The DPS is responsible for the day to day management of the premises.
- 1.4 The Premises Licence authorises the carrying out of the Relevant Licensable Activities as follows:
- E. Performance of live music (Indoors)
 - F. Playing of recorded music (Indoors)
 - G. Performance of dance (Indoors)
 - H. Entertainment of a similar description to that falling within E, F or G (Indoors)
 - I. Provision of facilities for making music (Indoors)
 - J. Provision of facilities for dancing (Indoors)
 - K. Provision of facilities for entertainment of a similar description to that falling within I or J (Indoors)
 - L. Late night refreshment (Indoors)
 - M The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption On the premises only
- 1.5 The times the licence authorises the Licensable Activities are 11.00am to 01.30am Monday to Sunday and a copy of the current Premises Licence is attached at **APPENDIX 1**.

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 On 27th November 2011 Thames Valley Police submitted an application for the Review of the Premises Licence on grounds of the Prevention of Crime and Disorder and the Protection of Children from Harm, the full Review Application and supporting evidence are contained at **APPENDICES 2 and 2 (1) respectively**.

2.2 The grounds for the Review Application although contained fully within the application itself can be summarised as follows;

- Serious issues of disorder, affrays, fights, inside the venue and outside by the venue's customers – report of a fight on 30/08/2011 at 03.15am – the premises is only licensed until 01.30am for all licensable activities
- Reports of customers leaving the venue at 03.45am
- Police Officers being assaulted
- Police Officers being obstructed
- Reports of staff and customers being very hostile towards Police Officers
- Report of CCTV not forthcoming – by not assisting the Police they are preventing the Police bringing a violent alcohol related offender to justice – seriously undermining the crime and disorder licensing objective
- Report of over zealous door staff
- Staff not reporting incidents to the Police
- Non-compliance of assistance from staff including the DPS (not willing to give statements) which is seriously undermining the crime and disorder licensing objective
- Report of the DPS no longer working at the venue
- A 17 year old being intoxicated and bottled having been drinking in the venue
- Intelligence report received alleging a 14 year old girl had been served alcohol in the venue
- Complaints of loud music
- High readings of drugs (Itemiser readings)
- Member of staff acting as door staff
- Breaches of licence in relation to door staff not being on duty at 1900 hours
- Premise advertising closing time of premise on Face Book as 4am

3. **APPLICATION – REVIEW OF PREMISES LICENCE**

3.1 The Licensing Authority is satisfied that this application for Review meets the appropriate legislative requirements within the Licensing Act 2003 and is therefore a valid application to be considered by the Licensing Sub-Committee.

- 3.2 The Review Application requests that due to the catalogue of incidents and non-compliance at the premises, the Premises Licence should be **revoked**.
- 3.3 However the Police have also asked that if Members are of the opinion that the Premises Licence should not be revoked, the licence should be suspended for a period of time to allow the following amendments and conditions to be put in place and imposed on the Premises Licence.
1. All licensable activity to cease at midnight on all days of the week.
 2. The closing hours of the premises to be 00.30am of all days of the week.
 3. Designated Premises Supervisor or Personal Licence Holder to be on the premises during all licensable activity.
 4. Thames Valley Police to be informed of all events with a minimum of 14 days notice to be given.
 5. Over 21's policy to be in place.
 6. Accredited SIA door team to be used inside the premises and outside from 1900 hours until close – 7 days of the week.
 7. CCTV Town Link Radio to be in place and used by door staff and Management.
 8. Last admission time to be 11.00pm.
 9. Designated Premises Supervisor or Personal Licence Holder to be trained on how to work the CCTV System to the standard where the nominated person can download any potential evidence required by Thames Valley Police employees or relevant Agencies.
 10. Suitably qualified first aider with appropriate first aid supplies to be on duty during all licensable activities.
 11. Polycarbonate glasses to be used.
 12. No bottles to be passed over the bar from 9.00pm to close 7 days a week.
 13. Incident Register to be in place and kept up to date and made available upon the request of Thames Valley Police and kept for a minimum of one year.
 14. All Staff members and SIA door staff to fully co-operate with Police Officers and make themselves available immediately upon the request of the Police Officer to give statements and provide CCTV.
 15. Door staff signing in and out Register to be in place and made available upon the request of Thames Valley Police and kept for a minimum of one year.

16. The Directors of 100 Lounge Ltd (The Premises Licence Holders) must provide full contact details to the Police and Slough Licensing Authority and be readily available.

4. **REPRESENTATIONS RECEIVED**

- 4.1 Responses to the Review Application from relevant Responsible Authorities have been received.
- 4.2 Response from Patricia Leroy – Local Safeguarding Children Board is attached at **Appendix 3**.
- 4.3 Response from Fiona Byrne – Neighbourhood Enforcement Team Environmental Officer is attached at **Appendix 4**.
- 4.4 Response from Levine Whitham – Food and Safety Team Senior Environmental Health Officer is attached at **Appendix 5**.
- 4.5 There were not any further responses from any other Responsible Authorities.

5. **RELEVANT GUIDANCE AND POLICIES**

- 5.1 The proceedings set out in the 2003 Act for Reviewing of Premises Licence represent a key protection for the community where problems associated with the licensing objectives are occurring after the grant or variation of a Premises Licence. Where a request to Review the licence is made by a Responsible Authority, the Licensing Authority will hold a hearing in respect of this, unless it, the applicant and the Responsible Authorities agree that a hearing is not necessary
- 5.3 Section 52 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides that the Sub-Committee must, having regard to the Review application and any relevant representations, take such of the steps listed below as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are:
 - (a) to modify the conditions of the licence, (which includes adding new conditions or any alteration or omission of an existing condition), for example, by reducing the hours of opening or by requiring door supervisors at particular times;
 - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence, for example, to exclude the performance of live music or playing of recorded music (where it is not within the incidental live and recorded music exemption);
 - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor, for example, because they consider that the problems are the result of poor management;
 - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
 - (e) to revoke the licence.
- 5.4 However, the Sub-Committee may consider it is not necessary to take any of the steps listed above to promote the licensing objectives. These are matters for the Sub-Committee to determine having regard to the evidence of all parties.

- 5.5 There is nothing to prevent a licensing authority issuing an informal warning to the licence holder and/or to recommend improvement within a particular period of time. However, where responsible authorities like the Police, Environmental Health or Trading Standards Officers have already issued oral or written warnings requiring improvement, licensing authorities should not merely repeat that approach.
- 5.6 Licensing authorities should also note that modifications of conditions and exclusions of licensable activities may be imposed either permanently or for a temporary period of up to three months. Temporary changes or suspension of the licence for up to three months could impact on the business holding the licence financially and would only be expected to be pursued as a necessary means of promoting the licensing objectives. So, for instance, a licence could be suspended for a weekend as a means of deterring the holder from allowing the problems that gave rise to the review to happen again. However, it will always be important that any detrimental financial impact that may result from a licensing authority's decision is necessary and proportionate to the promotion of the licensing objectives.
- 5.7 In deciding which of these powers to invoke, it is expected that licensing authorities should so far as possible seek to establish the cause or causes of the concerns which the representations identify. The remedial act taken should generally be directed at these causes and should always be no more than as necessary and proportionate response.
- 5.8 The Sub-Committee should also consider and make use of the 'Yellow and Red Cards' system as directed and recommended by The Department of Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS).

ANNEX 1 - MANDATORY CONDITIONS

AUTHORISATION OF ALCOHOL

The Supply or sale of alcohol is prohibited when:

- a) at a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence
- b) at a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence has been suspended

In addition every supply of alcohol must be made or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.

Condition 1, with effect 6th April 2010

1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children-

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-

- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on-

- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

Condition 2, with effect 6th April 2010

The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

Condition 3, with effect 6th April 2010

The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

Condition 4, with effect from 1st October 2010

(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies

to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

Condition 5, with effect from 1st October 2010

The responsible person shall ensure that-

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE**CRIME AND DISORDER****Door Supervisors**

1. Will be correctly registered with the Security Industry Authority (S.I.A)
2. Will display the correct name/ Identification Badge.
3. Will carry an S.I.A licence at all times.
4. Door supervisor ratio agreed by the Police and Licensing Authority. which is 1:80 persons.
5. A female door supervisor will be available if searches are to be conducted on female customers.
6. Will wear clothing that can be easily and clearly identifiable on Closed Circuit Television (C.C.T.V) - yellow reflective tabards.
7. Will be in attendance at the entrance of the premises from 1900hrs until the main exit doors to the premises are closed, and at any time when patrons may be queuing for access.
8. A Door Supervisor Register is kept and includes names, dates, and times of the persons employed in such capacity.

C.C.T.V

9. A C.C.T.V system has been installed and is working to the satisfaction of Thames Valley Police and the Licensing Authority.
10. Recordings will be maintained for 31 days.
11. If the C.C.T.V equipment fails, the Police and the Licensing Authority will be informed immediately by telephone and immediate steps will be taken to put the equipment back into working order.
12. A notice will be displayed at the entrance to the premises advising that C.C.T.V is in operation.
13. At least one C.C.T.V camera will be in operation at the front of the premises at all times when the premises is in

use.

Bottles and Glasses

14. Customers carrying open or sealed bottles or glasses will not be admitted to the premises at any time.
15. Customers will not be permitted to take open containers of alcoholic or soft drinks from the premises.
16. Bottle bins for collection or empty bottles will not be accessible to members of the public.

Radios

17. All instances of crime and disorder will be reported to the Police as soon as reasonably practicable via C.C.T.V or the radio.

Capacity Limits

18. We have a capacity limit of 80 to prevent overcrowding which could lead to crime and disorder.
19. The capacity limit is based on advice from the Police, Fire Service and own risk assessment.
20. Door supervisors will ensure the capacity limits are not exceeded, at all times.

Proof of Age Cards

21. We have a proof of age policy that has been formulated in discussion with the Police and the Licensing Authority.

Drugs

22. We have an anti-drugs policy that has been agreed following discussion with the Police and the Licensing Authority and is in line with the Safer Clubbing Guidance.
23. A secure facility to store controlled drugs prior to collection is available.
24. A drugs register will be maintained.
25. The Police will be notified of all seizures of controlled drugs.

General

26. We have a policy on the safe management of large groups, i.e. hen and stag parties.

- 38. For the final hours of opening the music is reduced in volume and is discernibly quieter.

Thames Valley Police are requesting the review of 100 Lounge, High Street, Slough, Berkshire, premises licence under the Prevention of crime and disorder licensing objective and the protection of children from harm

100 Lounge Ltd is the Premise Licence holder and Mr Sandeep Sharma is the Designated Premises Supervisor.

Several meetings have been held with the Designated Premises Supervisor of the premises, Slough Borough Council Licensing Department and Police licensing to discuss licensing issues in an aim to try to resolve issues. We have also had meetings where the Premises Licence Holder has been invited to attend meetings and to date has not appeared. There is also some confusion that needs to be clarified concerning a Mr Jagdeep Singh who is named as a Director of the company but Mr Jagdeep Singh Phull, whom we believe is the same person, denies this. It must be said that Mr Jagdeep Singh Phull takes a very active interest in the business and has telephoned me and attended Windsor Police Station personally to speak to me about the premises. We believe that Mr Phull has been involved in this premise as far back as October 2010.

I have detailed the relevant incidents that have prompted to Thames Valley Police applying to review this premises licence.

28/11/2010 at 03.45am

Group of 4 males left the premises and started fighting. Officers arrived and made 2 arrests. Other customers then came out of the premise and tried to obstruct Police Officers, 2 other

arrests were made for Section 5 Public order and one for assault on police. Officer activated his emergency button due to the hostile crowd.

02/01/2011 at 0245am URN 98 2/1/2011

Complaint to Police by local resident of very loud music still playing inside the premises. Complainant states this is an ongoing issue.

04/03/2011 at 1129pm URN 1732 & 1416

A member of door staff was assaulted outside the premise after refusing entry to two males. The member of staff (Mr Sandeep Sharma – DPS) received ABH injuries to his hand and was punched in the face. Police observed two males running away being chased by door staff. The member of staff was very hesitant about making a complaint and contacted their Manager as to whether they should make a complaint or not. Door staff did make a complaint but Mr Sandeep Sharma current DPS, withdrew his complaint and informed the Officer that he no longer worked at the premise.

05/03/2011 at 01.45am URN 138 5/3/2011

Male assaulted inside the premise after a verbal altercation, as a result he suffered a cut to the head. Male attended hospital where he reported the incident to the Police. Incident was not called into Police by any staff at the premise.

27/03/2011 at 00.41am URN 67 27/03/2011

Police witnessed a fight outside the premise, one person on the floor after receiving significant blows to the head. Ambulance attended.

22/04/2011 at 2038pm URN 1429 22/04/2011

Complaint to Police by local resident complaining of loud music, it is so loud it can be heard in the caller's residence.

24/04/2011 at 2am URN 211 24/04/2011

Complaint to Police by local resident complaining of loud noise/music coming from the premises – caller states this is an ongoing issue

25/04/2011 at 00.55am URN 73 25/4/2011

Complaint to Police by local resident complaining of loud noise coming from the premises – caller states this is an ongoing issue.

12/06/2011 at 00.53am URN 106 12/06/2011

Call to Police from aggrieved stating that he had been hit inside the premise. CCTV operator also received a report that a member of 100 Lounge door staff had possibly been assaulted. On Police arrival neither wanted to make any complaint. The member of door staff had left the premise before Police attended but informed the Manager that he didn't want to report anything.

03/07/2011 at 00.18am URN 46 3/7/2011

Report of a fight at the premise, aggressive male being held down by security. Upon Police arrival no offences were disclosed by door staff.

05/08/2011

Joint Agency drugs dog operation. Indication given by the dog on one male. The male became abusive towards the dog handler and officers. Police Officers ejected the male and he was issued with a Section 27 notice to leave the area. There was one male working on the door in possession of a clicker and taking money, but did not hold a SIA licence. The DPS, Sandeep Sharma was unable to operate the CCTV system and no drugs policy in place as per the condition on the licence. Customers and staff were very hostile towards Police.

10/08/2011

Meeting between Debie Pearmain, Licensing Officer, TVP, Mick Sims, Licensing Manager SBC, Mr Sandeep Sharma DPS, and Rachael Rumney, Senior Licensing officer SBC. Meeting called as a result of the Drugs dog Operation held on 5/08/11. Issues raised – Lack of respect shown to police officers by staff and customers, inability to operate the CCTV system on the night, lack of drugs dog policy (14 Days given from this date to submit a relevant drugs policy), an unlicensed person operating as door staff. Advice given that if things do not change at this venue the premises licence may be subject to review.

14/08/2011 at 02:00am

Incident witnessed by Police Officers – An altercation at the entrance of the premises which involved some pushing, one male was moved away from the premise, another male shortly after this came out of the premise, shouted at another male, and then began to throw punches at the males head. The Aggressor was arrested for Affray.

30/08/2011 at 03.15am URN 106 30/08/2011

Assault inside the premises – male was punched to the face causing him to be knocked out lacerations to his cheek and swelling to his face. Upon Police arrival door staff stated that they didn't have any knowledge of the incident. Male was taken to hospital with ABH injuries.

7/09/2011

Letter from Mr Mick Sims, Slough Licensing Manager to the DPS, Sandeep Sharma following a meeting on 10/08/2011 requesting that a Drugs policy be submitted at the earliest opportunity.

23/09/2011

Copy of policy regarding drugs and alcohol in the work place. Submitted as the 'Drugs Policy' that was requested but does not relate to what was requested.

27/09/2011 at 00:20am

Member of door staff assaulted. Both the door supervisor and management did not wish to support proceedings and a request for CCTV was not forthcoming. The Officer makes the following comment, 'Both door supervisor and management have been informed that by not helping Police in their enquiries they are preventing the Police in bringing a violent alcohol related offender to justice.'

28/09/2011

Email to Debie Pearmain from Inspector Boomer, summarising an ABH incident on 27/09/2011. A member of door staff was assaulted and they have refused to support police proceedings.

01/10/2011 at 00.28am URN 55 1/10/2011 refers

Disturbance outside the premises. Section 27 order issued by Police Officer.

02/10/2011 at 01:40am

Report of a fight on the dance floor, 5 or 6 people involved. Police observed numerous very drunk people leaving the premises. No further complaints made. Premises closed early. Lots of attitude/hostility from the clientele.

04/10/2011

E-mail correspondence from Slough Borough Council to Debie Pearmain regarding Mr Sandeep Sharma, the DPS of the premises being unavailable to attend a meeting.

05/10/2011 at 11:30am

Information received that door staff at the premise are being heavy handed and taking customers out the back and 'sorting them out'.

07/10/2011

Print off of a Facebook page for the premise advertising a closing time of 04:00am. Licence clearly states that all licensable activities will cease at 01:30am.

07/10/2011 at 7.10pm

Attended premise with 2 Police Officers to conduct a licensing check - 2 x breaches of licence found. No door staff on duty at 1900hrs and no female door staff available for searches. Person on duty, non PLH, Mr Barneet Singh. I asked Mr Singh what time the music was licensed to and he replied 01.45am. I reminded Mr Singh that all licensable activities are licensed until 01.30am. Door staff signing in register showed that door staff regularly sign on between 21:00hrs and 22:00hrs.

10/10/2011 at 08:30pm

Mr Phull, Mr Barneet Singh and a Mr Imran Hafeez attended Windsor Police Station to speak to Debie Pearmain, Police Licensing Officer.

A discussion was had with Mr Phull, and as it was not a convenient time a meeting for the following day was arranged. Mrs Pearmain was informed by Mr Phull that the noise issue had been resolved. Mrs Pearmain informed Mr Phull that there were further issues to be discussed at the future meeting. Mr Phull informed me that he had nothing to do with the business/company, but interestingly Mr Hafeez did not speak at all.

11/10/2011

Letter from Mick Sims, Licensing manager, Slough Borough Council to Mr Jagdeep Singh Phull and Mr Imran Hafeez regarding the drugs policy document submitted not being suitable, as it relates to staff rather than the use of controlled drugs in the premises by members of the public. Relevant advice is also given in the letter as to what a drugs policy should entail. A deadline of 14 days from the date of the letter was set for submission of a revised drugs policy.

14/10/2011 at 10.00pm

Joint agency drugs dog operation. 2 x indications given by the drugs dog. Swabs tested on the itemiser gave a 4.89 cocaine indication in the men's toilet, and a 3.32 cocaine indication in the ladies toilet. These readings indicate a medium to high reading.

On the same occasion the door staffs register was checked. Both door staff signed in at 2200 (10.00pm) – breach of licence.

16/10/2011 at 0123am URN 129 16/10/2011

Male contacted Police from inside 100 Lounge saying his life was in danger and that males were trying to fight him. A separate public order incident then occurred where a male was punched to the face outside this premise and two people were arrested for ABH, Affray and Assault on Police.

28/10/2011 at 01.48am URN 87 28/10/2011

Report from a member of the public to the Police informing us that there was a fight outside the premise. Captured on CCTV. Group dispersed one male identified as a suspect arrested. Others that were stop checked were also found to be under aged. The aggrieved was 17 years old, intoxicated and had been bottled. He had been drinking in this premise. Incident caused criminal damage to a vehicle and was not called in by security.

04/11/2011 at 01:33am

Intelligence received concerning the premises allowing a 14 year old female in and her being served alcohol.

06/11/2011 at 01.23am URN 154 6/11/2011

Report from CCTV operator informing Police that there was a public order incident outside the premise - door staff were restraining 2 males. Upon Police arrival no-one would disclose what had happened.

As you can see the crime and disorder licensing objective and protection of children from harm licensing objective are being severely undermined. You can see from this report that we have had:

Serious issues of disorder, affrays, fights, inside the venue and outside by the venue's customers – report of a fight on 30/08/2011 at 03.15am – the premises is only licensed until 01.30am for all licensable activities

Reports of customers leaving the venue at 03.45am

Police Officers being assaulted

Police Officers being obstructed

Reports of staff and customers being very hostile towards Police Officers

Report of CCTV not forthcoming – by not assisting the Police they are preventing the Police bringing a violent alcohol related offender to justice – seriously undermining the crime and disorder licensing objective

Report of over zealous door staff

Staff not reporting incidents to the Police

Non-compliance of assistance from staff including the DPS (not willing to give statements) which is seriously undermining the crime and disorder licensing objective

Report of the DPS no longer working at the venue

A 17 year old being intoxicated and bottled having been drinking in the venue

Intelligence report received alleging a 14 year old girl had been served alcohol in the venue

Complaints of loud music

High readings of drugs (Itemiser readings)

Member of staff acting as door staff

Breaches of licence in relation to door staff not being on duty at 1900 hours

**POLICY ON ALCOHOL &
DRUGS
IN THE WORKPLACE**

Policy on Alcohol And Drugs In The Workplace

1. 100 Lounge believes that it is essential that all employees, workers and those who render services to the Company or at the Company's premises are in full command of themselves and of all of their faculties throughout the working day.
2. 100 Lounge requires you to present yourself for work on each occasion required under your contract in complete command of all your faculties i.e. without any dependence on alcohol or any other drugs of a non-medicinal nature and to maintain that state until the completion of your working hours under your contract. If during the course of your working day you have to take medicinal drugs on a regular basis, this fact should be known to Person Incharge confidentially
3. In the event that you present yourself at work or during working hours you are in a condition where Person Incharge believes you to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs and you are not able to carry out your duties in a proper, fit and safe way you will not be allowed to commence work or continue work. Instead you will be suspended without pay and not allowed to return until such a time as you are in full control of your faculties
4. In addition such behaviour will be subject to the disciplinary procedure of 100 Lounge and after due investigation may result in dismissal as a result of gross misconduct
5. If 100 Lounge suspects that you are in the possession of alcohol or drugs you will be required to consent to a search of your belongings. If you are found to be in possession of any alcohol or illegal substances you will be suspended from your duties pending further investigation. This matter will be dealt with under the Company's disciplinary procedure and after due investigation it may result in dismissal for gross misconduct.
6. If 100 Lounge believes you are dealing, buying, selling or receiving drugs or alcohol you will be suspended from your duties while an investigation is carried out. Where a criminal offence is suspected the Company shall inform the police
7. All employees and workers are required to inform 100 Lounge or any appropriate person if they suspect any fellow worker may be acting in breach of this policy.
8. All employees are required to report to the person incharge should they find any drugs or suspect any customer to be in possession of any drugs while in the premises. Such drugs are then to be recovered by the person incharge; store them in a bag provided by Thames Valley Police and inform the police with immediate effect accordingly.

Further to the report dated 25th November 2011 requesting a premises licence review for the above, I would like to submit the following evidence to this case:

26/11/2011 at 01.20am

Licensing check conducted by PC Lamb and PC Whelan. Officers reported the following:
Several patrons very drunk
CCTV working but timecode shows 14.14 hrs at 01.20am

26/11/2011 at 01.43am

PC Lamb was outside 100 Lounge, when a disturbance was seen in the doorway of the premise. Two males were locked in a struggle, one male appearing to be the aggressor. Security and Police intervened and the two males were separated. The aggressor was highly intoxicated and aggressive and was arrested for being drunk and disorderly. The second male made no allegation or report of assault, this male had a cut to his forehead. At the time of this incident Rachael Rumney, Senior Licensing Officer, SBC arrived at the location. The music could still be heard playing inside 100 Lounge. Music is only licensed until 01.30am.

29/11/2011

Telephone call from the DPS Mr Sandeep Sharma to inform me that he had received the review paperwork and that he was no longer the DPS at the premises and had not been so for the last 2 months. He informed me that he would email me this and would be speaking to his boss, Mr Phull.

29/11/2011

Email from the DPS Mr Sandeep Sharma informing me that he is on Annual leave since 7th November 2011 until the 4th January 2012 and that he has authorised Mr Barneet Singh to be responsible in his absence.

05/12/2011

Intelligence report stating that 100 Lounge are having regular lock-ins and customers are snorting cocaine openly in there.

17/12/2011 at 01.45am

Report from Police Officer. Officers were called over to the premises by doorstaff. Aggrieved was punched outside 100 Lounge after coming out for a cigarette, offender punched male in the face knocking him to the ground and claims he was kicked in the head before offender made off. Door staff unhelpful, they didn't seem to have intervened or bothered to detain the suspect. After talking to the aggrieved Officer went over to try and find the door staff and they had all vanished. It took 100 Lounge a long time to answer/open the front door. When the door was opened by what is believed to be the owner and he was asked for CCTV he stated, "What now" When Officers told him they needed it he said he could download onto memory stick tomorrow. Officers requested the CCTV be dropped off at Slough front counter. It is the Officers view that the door staff were not doing their job and they all disappeared quickly when officers needed to get an account of the incident from them.

I can confirm that as of 9th January 2012 PC Adams has informed me he has not received the requested CCTV footage.

23/12/2011 at 10.00pm

Report from Police Sergeant Wordsworth of an intoxicated and disorderly female being given words of advice about her behaviour and being sent on her way home by Officers. She promptly went to the 100 Lounge and was let in straight away, despite her clearly intoxicated state. The door staff were then advised of her condition and claimed that she appeared ok, so they had let her in. The female was subsequently ejected after having one drink in the bar and was sick outside the front of the bar. After it became clear she would not be able to get home safely without assistance the female was transported home by Police for her own safety. She was later arrested near her home address.

28/12/2011

The following email complaint was received by Slough Borough Council:

Dear Licensing Officer,

I went on Saturday (17 Dec 2011) 100 lounge Restaurant with my partner and a friend for drink and I find it very difficult to understand that 'What is 100 lounge? Is it a restaurant, a bar, a night club or a strip club?' because there was a male stripper who was performing that night (17 Dec 2011, Saturday). One thing I am sure that it was not a private party. If that was a private party then it should be held in a private room. My friends have told me that the door was closed at 2:00 AM but a lot of people stayed there as an after party which was held in the basement of the premises till 6:00 AM. The people are getting in and out from the back door which leads to the same back exit as the council back exit party was still on till 6:00 AM and there was a lot of people into the premises in the basement till 6:00 AM after closing the door and alcohol served till 6:00 AM on the double price and that party is happening every Saturday.

The main concern is with strip dance and I did research on this topic and I find out that the presenter is updating all the events on Facebook as you can see on this link <https://www.facebook.com/arkadiusz.bialas1?sk=wall> (presenter name -Arkadiusz Bialas). The video for the same is sent as an attachment below or you can download from <http://mbf.me/tg2S5>.

There is another update on the profile that there is another same event 31 December 2011 from 10:30 PM as you can see on his Facebook profile <https://www.facebook.com/arkadiusz.bialas1?sk=wall>. I am surprised that it is all happening right next to my council. For the last events and after party you can look at their CCTV cameras which supposed to be in working order for 24 hours and my council back exit cameras.

I would appreciate if you keep this information as private and confidential and if anything wrong is done in that premises then please do something about it.

02/01/2012

The following email complaint was received by Slough Borough Council:

To Whom it might concern,

I would like to report the incident that happened on the New Year's Eve in the restaurant "100 Lounge" at 100 High Street Slough.

I was in the restaurant with my friends and at around quarter past three in the morning my friend went out for a cigarette and was not allowed to get back in. All her belongings were - the handbag, the jacket, mobile phone - were still in the premises. As per my conversation with her the next day she did make a complaint to the police as the police were outside the premises (there should be some record with the police as they were outside till about 3:45am). The police was trying to help her by knocking the door and the windows. They even tried the back door but did not get any response even though all the customers and the staff were still in the basement at the premises.

My friend was left out alone at night in the cold, without her phone, the jacket and with no house key.

Myself I left the party at about 5 o'clock even though the party was still going on.

I was wondering why my friend wasn't allowed to get back to the premises at least to take her belongings even with the police help?

I hope the mandatory actions will be taken and such things not to happen in the future.

On the 13th September 2011 Slough Borough Council received a noise complaint alleging that loud music, talking and shouting from the smoking area and building of 100 High Street, Slough was clearly audible in the complainants nearby residence at night and into the early hours of the morning which was causing the complainant distress. The complainant had previously called the police regarding this noise.

A noise recorder was installed in the complainants property on the 16th until the 23rd September 2011. From the evidence obtained on the noise recordings, the noise was a statutory nuisance for which I served a noise abatement notice on 100 Lounge Ltd. Music, talking, shouting and singing were clearly audible in the complainants property at times up until 2.00am. Noise recordings were made on numerous days over the seven day period for which the noise recorder was installed. This notice required the company to ensure that noise from amplified music from the premises and noise associated with customers talking, shouting and singing outside the building and in the rear yard does not cause a nuisance to nearby properties. If this notice is breached the company have committed an offence for which they can be prosecuted.

The complainant was given a telephone number to call if the noise was loud and affecting them in their property. By ringing this number an Environmental Health Officer would witness the noise from within their property and determine if the notice was breached. To date the complainant has not called this number for any noise to be witnessed. I have tried to call the complainant numerous times since and my calls have not been returned.

On the 11th November 2011 at 12:15am I was walking down Slough High Street accompanied by my team leader Ian Blake and colleague Rhian Richards. We walked past 100 Lounge and the noise from this premises was very loud on the High Street. We then walked around the back of the premises through Buckingham Gardens car park and nearby residential properties. The music was clearly audible at this location. It was clear that the music was coming from this premises and was very loud in the surrounding locations however to date I have only received one complaint regarding this premises in September. Since the notice was served no information has been received with regards to a breach of the notice.

The noise abatement notice is still open and if the complainant or other nearby residents were to call the Council or the out of hours Environmental Health Officer to witness a breach of the notice then this notice would be enforceable.

I have spoken with Mr Singh and Mr Sharma from 100 Lounge regarding noise from the premises. They have made alterations to the way in which they conduct their business following our discussion. They initially put self closing units on the back door to help with the escape of noise from this location. When it was determined that the noise was still clearly audible they informed me that they were only allowing customers to smoke at the front of the premises.

I submit the above information to the licensing sub committee for consideration as the events to date relate to the prevention of public nuisance. Noise witnessed from the premises in September 2011 was a statutory nuisance. To date since I was not received further information from the complainant or other local residents to determine if the noise continues to be audible in residential properties nearby and thereby constitute a statutory nuisance.

In order to prevent public nuisance I would encourage the licensing sub committee to consider the alteration of the permitted opening hours for the premises. In addition it is recommended that the rear yard of the premises is not permitted as a smoking area for patrons.

Slough Borough Council has continuously faced difficulties with this premises, in achieving compliance with legislative requirements, in addition to difficulties over obtaining confirmation of the ownership of the business. In particular:

An initial food hygiene inspection was undertaken on **18th July 2011**, as this business was in new ownership. Upon arriving at the premises, I met with Mr Jay Khan, who I recognised from managing The Green Chilli Restaurant, operated by GC Foods Slough Limited, previously operating from this address. Green Chilli had a pending prosecution for numerous food hygiene offences, however this prosecution was lost as the company went into Liquidation, prior to 100 Lounge Limited opening.

Jay Kan advised me he was in charge in the absence of Mr Imran Hafeez. Although Jay Khan refused to provide me with any identification of his name when requested. I was doubtful of his identity, which I suspected to be Mr Jagdeep Singh Phull. Barneet Singh was also present, who claimed to help behind the bar only. Interestingly every visit to this premises, including when it was trading as Green Chilli, Barneet Singh has been present and working at the premises on each occasion.

Jay Khan then left the premises and Mr Imran Hafeez arrived claiming to be the sole director of 100 Lounge Limited, the food business operator of this premises. When requested Imran Hafeez completed a food business registration form, which legally should have been completed 28 days prior to opening the business. A copy of the registration form is attached.

During the visit, I noted a food hygiene certificate for Mr Jagdeep Phull, dated 21.4.11, and a second certificate for BIIAB national certificate for a premises license holder, also for Mr Jagdeep Singh Phull, dated 6.12.10.

Food hygiene and Health & Safety standards found during the inspection were seriously deficient, with no food safety management system, standards of cleaning were poor, numerous food items covered in mould and clearly out of date. A warning was given and report sent.

Following this inspection, a revisit was undertaken on **4th October 2011** to check compliance. The director Mr Imran Hafeez was unavailable and told out of the country. In his absence Sheetal Sharma was managing the kitchen. Barneet Singh was also present, who claimed to helping behind the bar only. Food safety standards at the time of visit was still poor, with an incomplete and ineffective food safety management system, standards of cleaning were poor, numerous food items covered in mould and clearly out of date. A warning was given and a further report sent.

A further revisit was undertaken on **28th November 2011**, where Barneet Singh was present behind the bar. Shortly Mr Imran Hafeez arrived at the premises, claiming this was his first day back at work for numerous weeks being away. Food safety standards at the time of visit was still poor, no food safety management system was available, standards of cleaning were poor, numerous food items covered in mould and with poor stock control procedures in place.

During each visit to this premises, barriers are put up by staff and the director, Mr Imran Hafeez, regarding reasons why they are not compliant, and of who are directors of 100 Lounge Limited. I believe there to be 2 directors of 100 lounge limited, namely Imran Hafeez and Jagdeep Singh Pull, who claims to be Jay Khan. Mr Imran Hafeez denies this.

1. CURRENT POSITION

- 1.1 Pit Stop operates under a Premises Licence which is held by Mr Harmeet Singh Vigg and Mr Mohan Singh Vigg. The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) at the time of a test purchase operation carried out at the premises on 13th October 2011 was Mr Harmeet Singh Vigg who holds a Personal Licence Number **LBLIL 1684** issued by the London Borough of Hillingdon.
- 1.2 The DPS is responsible for the day to day management of the premises.
- 1.3 The Premises Licence authorises the carrying out of the Relevant Licensable Activity – The sale by retail of alcohol for consumption OFF the premises only
- 1.4 The times the licence authorises this Licensable Activity are 09.00am to 11.00pm Monday to Sunday and a copy of the current Premises Licence is attached at **APPENDIX 1.**

2. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

- 2.1 On 29th November 2011 Thames Valley Police submitted an application for the Review of the Premises Licence on grounds of the Protection of Children from Harm, the full Review Application and evidence is contained at **APPENDIX 2.**
- 2.2 The grounds for the Review Application although contained fully within the application itself can be summarised as follows;
 - Alcohol being sold to an underage boy during a joint test purchase operation involving SBC Trading Standards Officers, Officers of the Licensing Team and Thames Valley Police.
 - Breach of conditions of the Premises Licence with regards to Mandatory Condition 4 with regards to non compliance with age verification, being unable to provide on request CCTV footage and being unable to produce the Refusals Register on request.
 - The person responsible for the sale of alcohol to the underage person was Mr Mohan Singh Vigg who is the holder of a Personal Licence.

3. APPLICATION – REVIEW OF PREMISES LICENCE

- 3.1 The Licensing Authority is satisfied that this application for Review meets the appropriate legislative requirements within the Licensing Act 2003 and is therefore a valid application to be considered by the Licensing Sub-Committee.

3.2 The Review Application requests that a total of 8 new conditions be imposed on the premises as detailed below and for the Premises Licence to be suspended for a period of time to enable the proposed additional conditions to be put in place and to be checked by Thames Valley Police:

1. Designated Premises Supervisor or nominated person to be trained on how to work the CCTV system to the standard where the nominated person can download any potential evidence required by Thames Valley Police or relevant Agencies.
2. The applicant and their staff are able to converse with customers, the public and representatives of Statutory Agencies to a level that satisfies Police and Trading Standards that they are able to meet the four licensing objectives.
3. Challenge 25 Policy to be in place.
4. The Designated Premise Supervisor shall ensure staff receives training on a regular basis in relation to the four licensing objectives contained within the Licensing Act 2003 for those authorised to sell alcohol. Written proof of all training shall be recorded and maintained and made available upon the request of Police, Trading Standards or Slough Borough Council Licensing Officers.
5. Two members of staff to be on the premises from 6.00pm until close.
6. Refusals Register to be in place, kept up to date and made available upon request of Police, Trading Standards or Slough Borough Council Licensing Officers.
7. To participate in Bottlewatch or UV marking scheme if requested by Police or Trading Standards.
8. The Licensing Sub Committee to issue a 'Yellow card' to the licensed premises as a warning that if a further review is necessary and matters have not improved the Premises Licence may be revoked. A 'Yellow card' will be clearly and visibly displayed at the Premises for a period of 12 months detailing the imposition of new conditions on the Premises Licence and that this warning has been given.

3.3 Condition 8 as requested by the Police is in line with the DCMS Guidance on the Red and Yellow Card Scheme which if agreed by the Committee will necessitate a 'Yellow Card' being displayed at the premises for a period of 12 months.

4. **REPRESENTATIONS RECEIVED**

4.1 There has not been any responses from any other Responsible Authority to this application

5. **RELEVANT GUIDANCE AND POLICIES**

- 5.1 The proceedings set out in the 2003 Act for Reviewing of Premises Licence represent a key protection for the community where problems associated with the licensing objectives are occurring after the grant or variation of a Premises Licence. Where a request to Review the licence is made by a Responsible Authority, the Licensing Authority will hold a hearing in respect of this, unless it, the applicant and the Responsible Authorities agree that a hearing is not necessary
- 5.3 Section 52 of the Licensing Act 2003 provides that the Sub-Committee must, having regard to the Review application and any relevant representations, take such of the steps listed below as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are:
- (a) to modify the conditions of the licence, (which includes adding new conditions or any alteration or omission of an existing condition), for example, by reducing the hours of opening or by requiring door supervisors at particular times;
 - (b) to exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence, for example, to exclude the performance of live music or playing of recorded music (where it is not within the incidental live and recorded music exemption);
 - (c) to remove the designated premises supervisor, for example, because they consider that the problems are the result of poor management;
 - (d) to suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
 - (e) to revoke the licence.
- 5.4 However, the Sub-Committee may consider it is not necessary to take any of the steps listed above to promote the licensing objectives. These are matters for the Sub-Committee to determine having regard to the evidence of all parties.
- 5.5 There is nothing to prevent a licensing authority issuing an informal warning to the licence holder and/or to recommend improvement within a particular period of time. However, where responsible authorities like the Police, Environmental Health or Trading Standards Officers have already issued oral or written warnings requiring improvement, licensing authorities should not merely repeat that approach.
- 5.6 Licensing authorities should also note that modifications of conditions and exclusions of licensable activities may be imposed either permanently or for a temporary period of up to three months. Temporary changes or suspension of the licence for up to three months could impact on the business holding the licence financially and would only be expected to be pursued as a necessary means of promoting the licensing objectives. So, for instance, a licence could be suspended for a weekend as a means of deterring the holder from allowing the problems that gave rise to the review to happen again. However, it will always be important that any detrimental financial impact that may result from a licensing authority's decision is necessary and proportionate to the promotion of the licensing objectives.

- 5.7 In deciding which of these powers to invoke, it is expected that licensing authorities should so far as possible seek to establish the cause or causes of the concerns which the representations identify. The remedial act taken should generally be directed at these causes and should always be no more than as necessary and proportionate response.
- 5.8 The committee should also consider and make use of the 'Yellow and Red Cards' system as directed and recommended by The Department of Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS).

13/10/2011 at 8.45pm

Joint Test Purchase operation involving Trading Standards, Licensing Department, SBC and Thames Valley Police Licensing. Mr Mohan Singh Vigg who is a Personal Licence Holder, sold alcohol to an under aged person. No age was requested or identification requested. When I requested CCTV footage Mr Mohan Singh Vigg did not know how to download the footage and did not understand what I was saying. Not being able to produce the requested CCTV footage is a breach of licence condition. I requested to see the Refusals Register, Mr Mohan Singh Vigg was unable to show me this Register – another breach of licence condition. It was also noted that when the Trading Standards Officer was speaking to Mr Mohan Singh Vigg it was decided

that when he attends the interview with Trading Standards a translator would be necessary. Thames Valley Police are concerned about the lack of communication from Mr Mohan Singh

Vigg in that he can not communicate in English. We would ask the question how he would challenge any under age person or drunken person?

Whilst waiting to speak to Mr Mohan Singh Vigg myself and one of the Licensing Officers, SBC witnessed him sell alcohol to 2 Polish males who were quite clearly intoxicated. At no time did Mr Mohan Singh Vigg challenge or refuse the sale.

08/11/2011

Mr Harmeet Singh and Mr Mohan Singh attended a pre-arranged meeting at Windsor Police Station to discuss the failed Test purchase where alcohol was sold to an under age person. Due to the under age person being sold alcohol Mr Harmeet Singh and Mr Mohan Singh were informed that Thames Valley Police would be applying to review the premises licence under the protection of children from harm licensing objective.

Both the Premises Licence Holders and Designated Premises Supervisor must take responsibility and be showing due diligence as far as possible. He and his staff should be fully committed in trying to stop the sale of alcohol to under aged persons and drunken persons. They should be adhering to the licence conditions already placed on the licence and not undermine the licensing objectives. In view of this we would request the premises licence be suspended to enable the following requested conditions be put into place and checked by Police:

Designated Premises Supervisor or nominated person to be trained on how to work the CCTV system to the standard where the nominated person can download any potential evidence required by Thames Valley Police or relevant Agencies.

The applicant and their staff are able to converse with customers, the public and representatives of Statutory Agencies to a level that satisfies Police and Trading Standards that they are able to meet the four licensing objectives.

Challenge 25 policy to be in place.

The Designated Premise Supervisor shall ensure staff receives training on a regular basis in relation to the four licensing objectives contained within the Licensing Act 2003 for those authorised to sell alcohol. Written proof of all training shall be recorded and maintained and made available upon the request of Police, Trading Standards or Slough Borough Council Licensing Officers.

Two members of staff to be on the premises from 6.00pm until close.

Refusals Register to be in place, kept up to date and made available upon request of Police, Trading Standards or Slough Borough Council Licensing Officers.

To participate in Bottlewatch or UV marking scheme if requested by Police or Trading Standards.

The Licensing Sub Committee to issue a 'Yellow card' to the licensed premises as a warning that if a further review is necessary and matters have not improved the Premises Licence may be revoked. A 'Yellow card' will be clearly and visibly displayed at the Premises for a period of 12 months detailing the imposition of new conditions on the Premises Licence and that this warning has been given.

1. The Application

- 1.1. An application is being made by Mr Josiah Kimani for a Street Trading Consent for 'Traders Diner' on Petersfield Avenue, Slough. A copy of the application is attached at **Appendix 'A'**.

Photographs of the trading unit and food hygiene and safety certificate have been included with the application and are attached at **Appendix 'B'**.

- 1.2. The application is for Street Trading Consent at the specified pitch between the hours of;

Monday to Sunday 9.00am and 22.00pm.

2. Background

- 2.1 In February 2011 the Licensing Committee recommended changes to the Council's Street Trading Protocol and Guidance. This would make all streets in Slough, Consent Streets, allowing anyone to apply for a Street Trading Consent and have it granted subject to consultation with local residents and in line with the Council's Policy.
- 2.2 On 19th April 2011, a meeting of the Full Council approved the recommendation of the Licensing Committee and made all streets within the Borough Consent Streets.
- 2.3 In addition a Street Trading Consent is also required where the trading takes place on any private land to which the public has access without payment.
- 2.4 'Traders Diner' is to be situated on Brookland's Business Park car park on Petersfield Avenue, which is private property. A copy of the site plan is attached at **Appendix 'C'**
- 2.5 The Licensing Office has consulted with all of the relevant responsible authorities, businesses and residential properties within a 100 yards of the proposed site. A total of 10 objections has been received and a copy of all the objections is attached at **Appendix 'E'**

3. Objections

As detailed in Point 2.5 above the responsible authorities, businesses and residential properties within 100 yards of the proposed site have been consulted on the new application.

A total of ten individual objections and a petition containing 18 signatures have been received objecting to the granting of this application.

All of the written objections and petition are attached to the report. The stated grounds for objecting to the application can be summarised as follows:

Increase in noise pollution
Increased disturbance to local residents
Pollution including smells and odours
Increase in the parking problems which already exist
Increase in non residents and vehicles to the area causing traffic problems
Increase in anti-social behaviour
Impact on local businesses in the area

In addition a response has been received from the Council's Food and safety Officer which is also attached at **Appendix 'E'**

Human Rights Act 1998

Article 6 of the Human Rights Act 1998 applies:

Article 6 – That in the determination of civil rights and obligations everyone is entitled to a fair and public hearing within a reasonable time by an independent and impartial tribunal established by law.

5. Grounds for Refusal

- 5.1 Section 7 sub-paragraph (2) of the Act details – Subject to sub-paragraph (3) (*Mandatory grounds for refusal*) the Council may grant a Consent if they think fit.
- 5.2 In essence the Council is not under any duty to grant a Street Trading Consent and need not specify statutory grounds for refusal. Therefore the matter to grant or refuse an application for a Street Trading Consent is at the total discretion of the Council.

6. Appeals

- 6.1 There is no right of appeal against the Council's decision to refuse to grant or renew a Consent or against the revocation or variation of a Consent.

7. Standard Conditions

- 7.1 The Council has already approved a set on Standard Conditions which are attached at **Appendix 'F'** and which will apply to and will be imposed on any Street Trading Consent that is granted.
- 7.2 The Council may also attach such other conditions they consider reasonably necessary.

8. Options Available

The Sub Committee may:

1. Grant the application as it stands in which case it will be subject to the Council approved Standard Conditions.
2. Grant the application with any variation deemed reasonably necessary subject to the Council approved Standard Conditions and any other specific conditions or restrictions the Committee deem reasonable and necessary.
3. Refuse the application.

(Options 1 and 2 above will be subject to the full application procedure being completed)

9. The Sub-Committee must have regard to:

- The Local Government Miscellaneous Provisions Act 1982
- Slough Borough Council Street Trading Consent Policy
- Slough Borough Council Street Trading Consent Standard Conditions.
- The nature of the business e.g. product sold
- The appearance and suitability of the trading unit.
- Any other condition the Members may feel necessary

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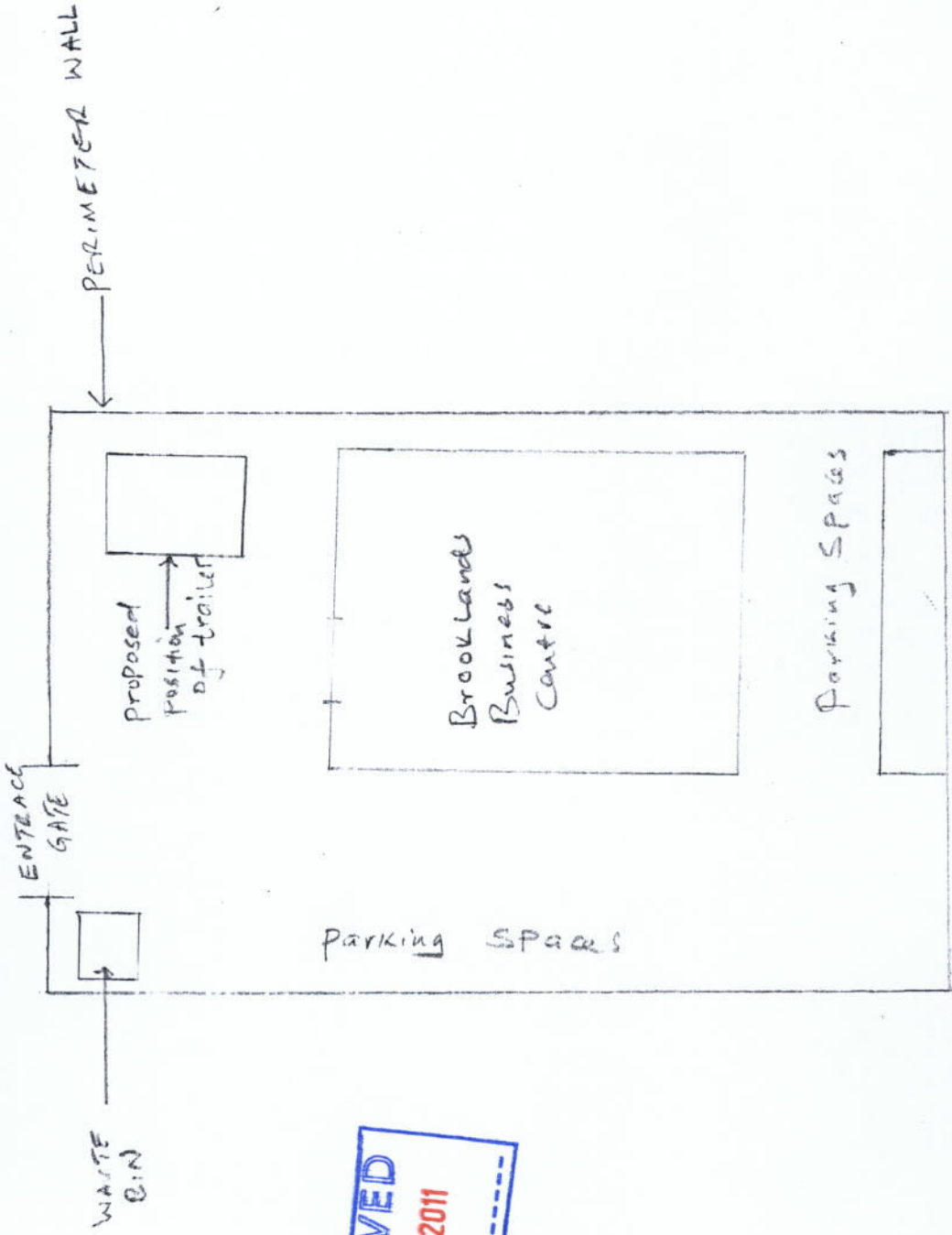

I am writing in opposition to the application for street trading consent for Traders Diner, Brooklands Business Centre, Petersfield Avenue, Slough, SL2 5DY. I am a resident whose property (Petersfield Avenue) is overlooked by the proposed diner. It is my belief that street trading consent for this development should not be extended for several reasons.

A primary concern is that Petersfield Avenue is a quiet residential neighbourhood and Traders Diner will be out of keeping compared to the local streetscape. The extremely long opening hours for the Diner will lead to increased noise in the evening and weekend disturbing local residents at a time when they would expect peace and quiet.

The Diner will also attract non residents into the area throughout the day and this will cause particular inconvenience in the evening and weekend. If the patrons of the Diner arrive by car there will be the issue of parking and increased noise and pollution from the traffic. If customers arrive by foot, there is the potential of litter being thrown into neighbouring gardens and increased noise from customers walking to and from the Diner.

The Diner will also increase pollution in the surrounding area. The Diner, like other fast food establishments, will emit cooking smells and make it unpleasant for neighbours to enjoy time in their gardens due to the noxious odour. There will be increased litter from the Diner with customers dropping packaging and food waste not only at the Diner itself but also in the surrounding neighbourhood. Vermin are likely to be attracted into the area due to the presence of food waste not being disposed of correctly by the Diner itself or by its customer base.

It is also irresponsible to have a fast food establishment opposite a Primary school. This will send the wrong message to impressionable young children and young children are more likely to leave litter.

With regard to the above Licensing Consultation Application, I have been asked as the Chairman of the local Residents Association to write to you on behalf of many of the elderly residents who live close to Brooklands House as they are totally against this proposal.

This is based on their 'real world' experiences of living in the area, and having seen the area being slowly being transformed into a new ghetto due to the large number of high rise flats/social tenants that have been flooded into the area over the last 9 years or so.

Currently the residents who live on the road already have to put up with unsociable people passing through in the evenings and night times when they are usually drunk (having been on a night out in the Town Centre).

The area at Brooklands House & Lion House has for the best part of 9 years given the locals a lot of grief. This has been caused by the Council giving permission to change how the sites are used. What was once just office and commercial space has now become a mish-mash of ideas – that have really affected the quality of life for local residents. Let me give an example:

- Lion House: Private Islamic school: great idea in terms of multiculturalism, but the local people who live on the road have seen an increase of traffic in the mornings and late afternoons. Residents have also frequently had their driveways blocked by Burka Clad women, and been witness to disturbances of the peace as a result of inadequate parking and space to allow traffic in the Interserve Works Unit.
- Brooklands Area 1: Private Tuition Classes: great idea in theory, in practice what it's meant for local residents is that what was once a calm and noise free weekend has resulted in a noisy school run which continues throughout the weekend...[imagine having a school run outside your house 7 days a week! That's exactly what some of our residents have to put with]
- Brooklands Area 2: Evangelist Group: again another great idea in theory, unfortunately the people that live closest to the centre have to put up with loud music every Sunday morning – their peaceful Sunday mornings have gone out of the window..

Sorry to go on a bit about previous planning issues/disasters, but I hope that it goes a small way in helping express the fears that local residents have with regards to a Trader Diner opening up in the area.

Other residents will also contact/write to the licensing department to express their views.

STREET TRADING CONSENTS – GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. **PERMITTED HOURS**

No street trading shall take place at any location except between the hours of 6.00 p.m. and the permitted terminal hour stated on the consent on any evening.

Or

Between 7.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. on any day.

Except with the prior permission of the Council

2. **COMPLIANCE WITH REGULATIONS**

The Consent Holder shall at all times comply with all current and future Statutes, Statutory Instruments, Traffic Regulation Orders, Byelaws and other regulations currently in force.

In particular, the Consent Holder shall comply with the requirements of the Management of Health and Safety at Work Regulations 1992, the Food Safety (General Food Hygiene) Regulations 1995, the Motor Vehicle Construction and Use Regulations. For Advice on these requirements contact – foodsafety@slough.gov.uk or tradingstandards@slough.gov.uk or telephone 01753 875255.

Such compliance shall not only be in respect of his or her, vehicle stall, trolley, stand, but also at or near the location or site used for the trading.

3. **NUISANCE**

The Consent Holder or his or her business shall not be the cause of any nuisance or annoyance to any other user of the highway, the occupier of any land or building. In particular the Consent Holder and or his or her assistant shall on all occasions when carrying on the business, be strictly sober and conduct him or herself in a proper, civil and decorous manner and the business will not be conducted in such a way as to cause annoyance to the occupier or person in charge of any shop or business premises or dwelling.

4. **DISCHARGES**

No water or waste materials, grease, debris of any type shall be discharged onto the highway or onto any adjacent property and must not be disposed of by use of public drains. Should any blockages take place and cleaning be required the Consent Holder will be liable for any cost incurred.

5. **STORAGE OF STOCK**

All stock and other miscellaneous articles shall be stored at all times on the stall, vehicle, stand or trolley and not on the surrounding footway.

6. **MAINTENANCE**

The Consent Holder's vehicle/stall, stand or trolley shall be kept in a clean, hygienic, safe and well maintained condition. (The Consent Holder's vehicle shall be maintained in a roadworthy condition, taxed, insured and with a current M.O.T. Certificate).

7. **REFUSE CONTAINERS**

At least one refuse container shall be provided by the Consent Holder and placed immediately adjacent to his/her stall vehicle/stall etc and be available at all times of trading for use by his/her customers. A notice shall also be displayed requesting customers to deposit litter in a waste container.

8. **CLEANSING**

The Consent Holder shall ensure that the area in the vicinity of his/her vehicle/stall etc is kept clear at all times of all refuse originating from his/her trade and from customers. The Consent Holder shall in particular, leave the site clear of all such refuse at the completion of trading. Should the area require cleaning the Consent Holder will be liable for the cost incurred.

9. **POSITION OF STALL ETC**

The Consent Holder shall ensure that his/her vehicle/stall etc is positioned only in the allocated area of the Consent Street for which he/she holds a Street Trading Consent and as specified in that Consent such a vehicle/stall etc shall be removed from the site after the close of the Trading day, except where permission has been granted by Slough Borough Council.

10. **DISPLAY OF CONSENT**

The Consent Holder shall display conspicuously on his/ vehicle/stall etc, a copy of the consent and or the badge issued with the consent and the person who is in charge and operating the vehicle/stall, stand or trolley when trading must produce the badge and or consent when requested by an Officer of the Council or a Police Officer.

11. **MOVING STALL ETC**

If a Consent Holder (duty holder / employer) or his/her employee is requested to move his/her vehicle/stall and or cease trading etc by an Officer of the Council or a Police Officer he/she shall immediately comply with that request.

12. **DISABLED PERSONS**

Each Consent Holder shall ensure that disabled persons and wheelchair users can be adequately served. This may involve such customers being served from outside the vehicle/stall etc. The Consent Holder's stall shall be of a size, type and design approved by the Council.

13. **STALLS ETC**

The type, colour and dimensions of any vehicle or trailer or cart or similar to be used under the Consent will be subject to approval by Slough Borough Council. No change of any approved such vehicle or similar is permitted without prior consent, in writing from Slough Borough Council. Photographs of the vehicle, staff, stand, trolley etc must be provided to Slough Borough Council.

14. **PARKING ON FOOTWAY**

The Consent Holder shall not park or position his/her vehicle, stall, stand, trolley etc on any part of a footway (except with the prior permission of Slough Borough Council).

15. **INSURANCE**

All Consent Holders as employer / proprietor shall have and maintain a proper insurance policy against public liability and third party risks. The minimum insurance cover shall be £5,000,000 and shall cover the operator's vehicle, or stall, stand, trolley, and any additional equipment under his/her control such as generators, gas containers, etc. If food is sold the insurance shall specifically include cover against food poisoning to the same amount. The insurance certificate or cover note shall be produced to the Council before the Street Trading Consent is issued and on renewal of the Consent. A copy shall also be displayed at all times when trading for inspection by an officer of the council or police officer.

16. **FIRE PRECAUTIONS**

Adequate precautions shall be taken by the Consent Holder to prevent the risk of an outbreak of fire at his/her stall or vehicle etc. Where a power source or heating appliance is present, e.g. a generator or bottled gas container, then a suitable fire extinguisher shall be provided. In addition, a fire blanket shall be provided in vehicles selling hot food.

17. **STORAGE OF EQUIPMENT**

The Consent Holder is responsible for the storage of all equipment associated with his/her trading and is not permitted to leave any vehicle, stall, ancillary equipment etc. on the site of trading at any time when trading is not taking place. (Also **condition 9** – position of stall etc).

18. **SETTING UP AND CLOSING DOWN**

The Consent Holder shall not enter the site of trading other than during the times specified except for the periods of 30 minutes before trading starts and after trading finishes for the purposes of setting up and dismantling the trading operation.

19. **SURRENDER OR REVOCATION OF CONSENT**

Where a street trading consent is surrendered or revoked the Council **may** remit the whole or part of any fee paid. The council shall be entitled to retain at minimum £100 of any fee paid.

In accordance with the above legislation, there is NO right of appeal in respect of the refusal, revocation or variation of a street trading consent. The Council has a discretion in these matters which is subject only to the principles exercised by the courts in judicial review proceedings

20. **TRANSFER OF CONSENT**

At the discretion of the Council, one assignment only of a consent may be allowed to an immediate next of kin, subject to satisfactory evidence of proof of identity. Where such a transfer of a consent is allowed, a new food registration form **MUST** be completed **AND** details of the employer reconfirmed. The sub-letting / renting out or sale of the consent is **not permitted**.

21. **BREACH OF HYGIENE AND SAFETY REGULATIONS**

The Council may remove the Consent at any time. Breach of any one or more of the Conditions OR breaches of Food Safety and or Health and Safety Regulations relating to the consent holders trade may make the consent holder liable to enforcement action in line with the Council's enforcement which may result in the street trading consent being revoked and or prosecution.

22. **FOOD HYGIENE TRAINING**

The Consent Holder and all food handlers working on the stall or vehicle must possess the current Food Hygiene Certificate (or equivalent). The Consent Holder and food handlers must attend the relevant course and obtain their certificate prior to the grant or renewal of a street trading consent.

23. **ELECTRICITY SUPPLY**

Consent Holders wishing to install an electricity supply point on the highway or other Council land shall do so only after obtaining the necessary licence from the Council. Contact 01753 875626 for further details.

24. **MOBILE GENERATORS**

Mobile generators will be used only with the permission of the Council and will be specified and sited in such a way as not to cause noise nuisance or other annoyance to the occupier of any other premises or any user of the highway.

25. **ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT**

All electrical equipment used in connection with the trading consent shall be constructed to a recognised standard, ideally to British Standard, and comply with all of the requirements of the latest edition of the IEE Regulations. In any case, electrical cables trailing across the highway or any part of the footway are **not permitted**.

26. **APPLICATIONS**

All applications for a Street Trading Consent (where applicable) shall be accompanied by a certificate signed by a CORGI registered gas installer to the effect that all gas appliances installed in or on the vehicle or trailer, and all cylinders, pipes and other fittings used for supplying gas to that appliance have been examined and found to be fitted in a safe and satisfactory manner and are suitable for their intended use.

27. **CHAIRS AND TABLES**

The Consent Holder may not, at any time, place tables, chairs, benches or similar articles on the footway, highway or any other land for the use of customers or staff of the trading consent for the consumption of food or drink sold by the Consent Holder.

28. **SIGNS ON PAVEMENT/HIGHWAY**

The Consent Holder shall not place any signs or any object upon the pavement or any other part of the highway or other public place, except within the allocated area of the Consent Street for which the Consent Holder holds a Street Trading Consent (except with the permission of Slough Borough Council). A definitive plan of the allocated area of the consent shall be submitted to the Council before issue of the consent.

29. **BOTTLED GAS**

The use of LPG or bottled gas for cooking or heating purposes in a mobile catering unit can be extremely dangerous unless certain basic safety codes of practice are followed. Under the terms of the Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974, the Consent Holder has a responsibility to ensure that all gas appliances and storage arrangements and installations are as safe as is reasonably possible, to protect the health, safety and welfare of staff, customers and any other individual. For copies of guidance notes or for specific advice in this respect, you should contact the L P Gas Association.

30. **DAMAGE TO PAVEMENT/HIGHWAY**

The Consent Holder will be responsible for any damage caused to the pavement, highway, including marks on the surface area where his/her vehicle, stall, etc has been positioned and will be liable for any cost incurred for such repairs.

31. **PLANT AND EQUIPMENT**

All plant and equipment used in connection with this trading consent shall be constructed to comply with a recognised standard, and ideally the relevant British Standard.

32. **SALE OF GOODS OR ARTICLES**

The Consent Holder and/or his/her assistants shall not sell or offer for sale any goods or articles other than those described within the Principle Terms of the Consent. In addition, only the consent holder may carry on a business or trade at the consent

location and will be restricted to the sale of goods. **Receipt or exchange of any other goods is totally prohibited.**

33. **PRICE LISTS**

The Consent Holder shall, whilst trading, display an accurate and comprehensive price list of all items for sale from the stall or vehicle.

34. **EMPLOYMENT**

The consent holder shall be the sole employer of any persons employed or working at the vehicle / stall / stand etc. Such employees must be a 'nominated person or assistant' listed on the application form. The council must be notified of any changes of 'nominated persons or assistants'.

35. **SPECIAL CONDITIONS**

The Council may at any time vary or add to the General Conditions with further Special Conditions on the Consent Certificate.

36. **CRIMINAL RECORDS CHECKS**

All consent holders, nominated persons or assistants must produce annually a **Basic Criminal Records Bureau check.**

37. **PREMISES LICENCE**

Where the business of a street trading consent involves the Provision of Late Night Refreshment i.e. the sale or supply of hot food or drink to members of the public between the hours of 23-00 hours and 05-00 hours, a **PREMISES LICENCE** will also be required in accordance with the **Licensing Act 2003.**

38. **MOBILE TRADERS**

All mobile trading (including ice cream vendors) to be restricted to a maximum of **20 minutes time period** in any one particular location.

STREET TRADING CONSENT (2011)

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 Slough Borough Council issues Street Trading Consents in accordance with Schedule 4 of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982.
- 1.2 All streets within the boundaries of Slough Borough Council are Consent Streets.
- 1.3 All persons wishing to sell any goods to the public within the Borough must apply for and be in possession of a Street Trading Consent before any such trading takes place.
- 1.4 If you intend to operate the supply of hot food or drink to members of the public between the hours of 23-00 hours and 05-00 hours you will also need to apply for a Premises Licence issued under the Licensing Act 2003. Full details and application packs can be requested from the Licensing Team.
- 1.5 Slough High Street has a specific number of pitches where Street Trading can take place. New applications for the High Street where there is no vacant pitch will not be accepted.

2. DEFINITIONS

- 2.1 Within the terms of the Slough Borough Council Street Trading Consent Protocol and Guidance the following definitions apply.
 - **The Council** – Means Slough Borough Council
 - **Street Trading** – Means the selling or exposing or offering for sale of any article (including a living thing) in any street.
 - **Street** – Includes:
 - (a) any road, footway, beach or other area to which the public have access without payment.
 - (b) A service area as defined in section 329 of the Highways Act 1980,
and also includes any part of a street
 - **Consent Street** – Means a street in which street trading is prohibited without the consent of Slough Borough Council.
 - **Consent** – Means a consent to trade on a street granted by Slough Borough Council.
 - **Consent Holder** – Means the person or company to whom the consent to trade has been granted by Slough Borough Council.

- **Nominated Person** – Means the person or persons nominated by the Consent Holder to assist or carry on the business on his or her behalf.
- **Static Trader** – Means a trader granted permission by Slough Borough Council to trade from a specific and approved location.
- **Mobile Trader** – Means a trader who moves from street to street. All mobile trading (including ice cream vendors) is restricted to a maximum of 20 minutes static trading time period in any one particular location.
- **Authorised Officer** – means an officer employed by Slough Borough Council and authorised by the Council to act in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1982.

2.2 Exempted Street Activities

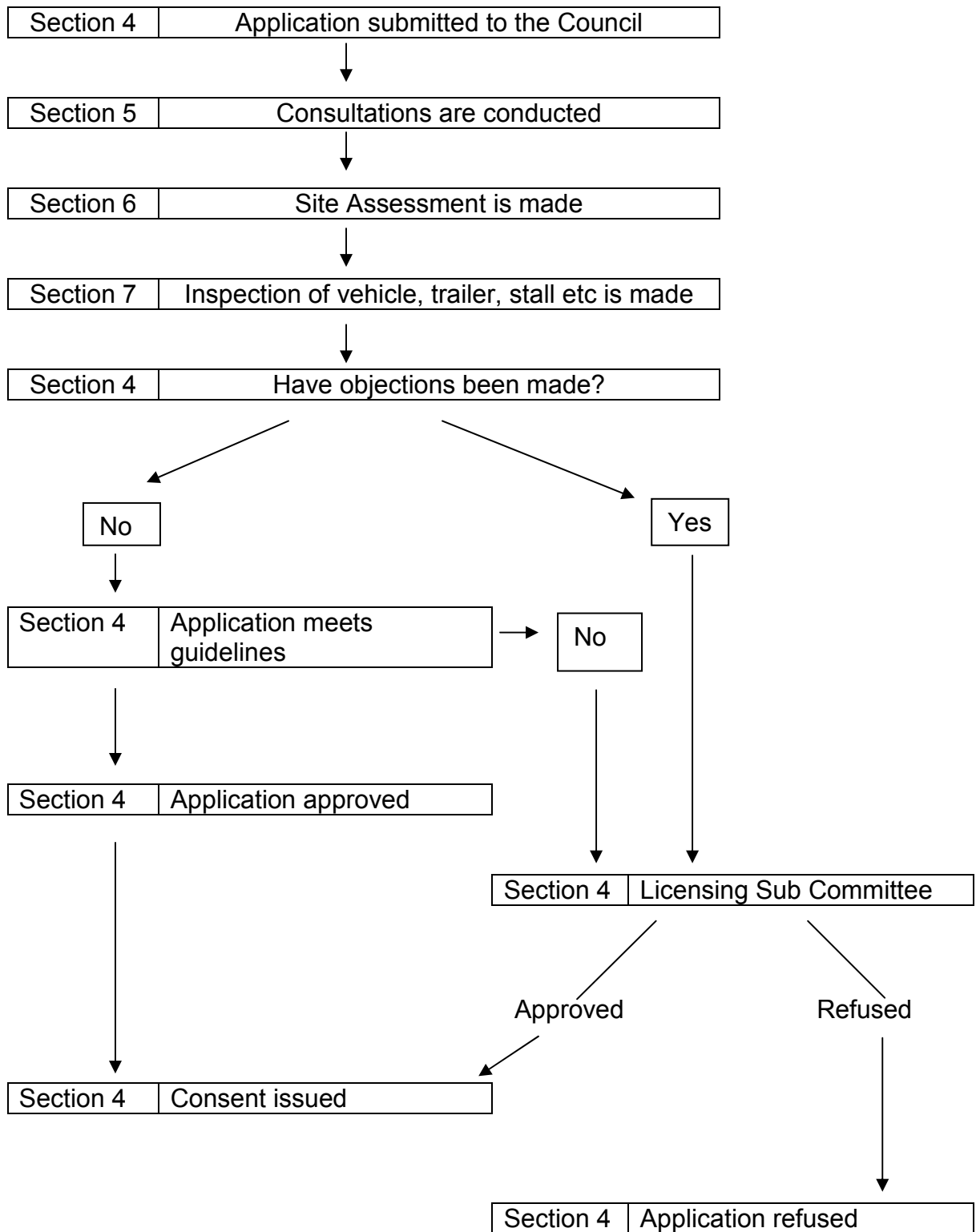
The following street trading activities are legally exempt from the requirement to obtain a prior consent from the Council:

- (a) trading by a person acting as a pedlar under the authority of a pedlar's certificate granted under the Pedlars Act 1871.
- (b) anything done in a market or fair the right to hold which was acquired by virtue of a grant (including presumed grant) or acquired or established by an enactment or order.
- (c) trading in a trunk road picnic area provided by the Secretary of State under section 112 of the Highways Act 1980.
- (d) trading as a news vendor.
- (e) trading which:
 - (i) is carried on at premises used as a petrol filling station; or
 - (ii) is carried on at premises used as a shop or in a street adjoining premises so used and as part of the business or shop.
- (f) selling things, or offering or exposing them for sale, as a roundsman.
- (g) the use for trading under Part VIIA of the Highways Act 1980 of an object or structure placed on, or in or over a highway.
- (h) the operation of facilities for recreation or refreshment under Part VIIA of the Highways Act 1980.
 - (i) the doing of anything authorised by regulations made under section 5 of the Police, Factories, etc. (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1916.

With regard to point (f) above it has been established in law that mobile ice cream sales normally will not be deemed to be exempt from street trading controls on the grounds that they are not roundsmen.

3. PROCEDURE FOR DETERMINING STREET TRADING APPLICATIONS

The application and approval procedure comprises of the following stages. The descriptions on the side of the boxes refer to the explanatory notes in the subsequent sections of this guide:



4. APPLICATION PROCEDURE

- 4.1 An application for a Street Trading Consent must be made to Slough Borough Council in writing. The application forms are included in this guidance at Appendix 1 (Application for Grant and Renewal) and Appendix 2 (Short Term / Temporary Consent) together with a copy of the General Terms and Conditions at Appendix 3. The application forms must be completed in full.
- 4.2 Applications can be made for Short Term / Temporary Consents on a daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly and six monthly basis. In all cases the full application for the Grant of a Street Trading Consent must be submitted in full. Thereafter the application form for a Short Term / Temporary Consent must be submitted at least 4 weeks prior to the first date the Consent is due to commence together with the appropriate fee for that period.
- 4.3 In keeping with the Council's policy on the introduction of e-Government, the Council consents to applications and other notices being given electronically in certain circumstances.
- 4.4 Incomplete applications will not be accepted.
- 4.5 A deposit of £250 will be required with the submission of the application. If the application is granted this sum will be deducted from the outstanding full payment, which must be paid in full as well as the criteria set out in the site assessment and inspection of the street trading unit being completed, prior to the Consent being issued. If the application is refused the sum will be used to cover the costs of administration and the consultation and therefore is non-refundable.
- 4.6 All applicants must provide proof of the right to work and reside in the UK. This can be done by providing a valid UK or European Union passport. Holders of other passports must show a valid visa that has at least six months remaining before its expiry at the time of application. A licence will only be granted until the expiry of the visa, and will only be renewed or extended on the production of a valid visa issued by the Home Office. Under no circumstances will letters from any source be accepted as proof of right to work. Applicants without a passport wishing to be able to work must have a valid ARC card or ISD document issued by the Home Office.
- 4.7 You will need to submit the following documents with the application.
- (a) Valid Passport and appropriate visa where necessary.
 - (b) 2 additional forms of identification (please see page 3 of application form).
 - (c) 1 (one) Passport size photographs of all applicants and nominated persons.
 - (d) 9 copies of plans of the preferred trading site to a scale of 1:1250
 - (e) Written consent from the owner of any private land where trading is to take place.
 - (f) 1 (one) colour photograph of any vehicle, stall, stand, trolley etc.
 - (g) Evidence of Public Liability Insurance (£5m)
 - (h) Copies of any certificate or accreditation for food safety, hygiene, health and safety etc. (*We will normally only accept certificates or accreditations obtained within the last 3 years*)
 - (i) Basic Criminal Records Bureau disclosure for **all applicants and nominated assistants**.
- 4.8 An applicant for first time Street Trading Consent should give a minimum of 28 days notice of the application to the Licensing Team.

- 4.9 Where the application is for the **renewal** of a Street Trading Consent, the application must be received in full **no later than 1 MONTH** before the renewal date.
- 4.10 When an application form is sent to you, please ensure that you are provided with a copy of the General Conditions for Street Trading Consents. You should make your self fully familiar with these conditions before submitting your application.
- 4.11 The address at which the Council will accept applications and notices is:-

5. CONSULTATIONS ON APPLICATIONS

- 5.1 Before a **new** application for a Street Trading Consent is determined the Council will carry out a consultation process with various persons and groups. In particular we will consult with:
- Thames Valley Police
 - Royal Berkshire Fire and Rescue Service
 - Ward Members
 - Slough Borough Council – Planning
 - Slough Borough Council – Highways
 - Slough Borough Council – Transport
 - Slough Borough Council – Trading Standards
 - Slough Borough Council – Parking and Development
 - Slough Borough Council – Food and Safety Team
 - Slough Borough Council – Neighbourhood Enforcement Team
 - Slough Borough Council – Environmental Services and Quality
 - The owner or occupiers of any property within 100 meters of the proposed site. This consultation will be by way of sending a copy of the Notice of Application to the relevant property owners
- Please note a consultation process will not be conducted for renewal applications, unless there has been issues raised by any of the above listed consultees during the term of the previous Consent.
- 5.2 The consultation will normally take 28 days in order that any objections to the application can be made in writing.
- 5.3 If no objections are received the application will be granted and the Street Trading Consent issued (subject to full payment being received)
- 5.4 The time scale for determination of a licence application where no objections have been received will normally take about 4 weeks as long as the full application criteria has been met.
- 5.5 If objections are received the application will be put before a Licensing Sub Committee

for determination.

- 5.6 The time scale for determination of a licence application where objections have been received may take between 6 to 8 weeks dependant upon the date of the sitting of the Licensing Sub Committee.
- 5.7 The Licensing Sub Committee is made up of local Councillors who will determine each application on its own individual merits. At the committee hearing the applicant(s) and objectors will be given the opportunity to put their case forward. The Committee are empowered to grant, refuse or apply any relevant conditions in addition to the General Conditions to any licence application put before them.

6. SITE ASSESSMENT

6.1 Street Trading Consents from static locations will not normally be granted where:

1. A significant effect on road safety would arise either from the siting of the trading activity itself, or from customers visiting or leaving the site, or
2. Where there are concerns over the recorded level of personal injury accidents in the locality where the street trading activity will be sited, or
3. There would be a significant loss of amenity caused by traffic, noise, odour or fumes, or
4. There is already adequate like provision in the immediate vicinity of the site to be used for street trading purposes, or
5. There is a conflict with Traffic Orders such as waiting restrictions, or
6. The site or pitch obstructs either pedestrian or vehicular access, or traffic flows, or places pedestrians in danger when in use for street trading purposes, or
7. The trading unit obstructs the safe passage of users of the footway or carriageway, or
8. The pitch interferes with sight lines for any road users such as at road junctions, or pedestrian crossing facilities, or
9. The site does not allow the Consent Holder, staff and customers to park in a safe manner
10. The street trading activity is carried out after dusk and the site is not adequately lit to allow safe access and egress from the site for both customers and staff.

7. INSPECTION OF STREET TRADING UNIT

7.1 The vehicle, van, trailer, stall or other device to be used for the proposed street trading activity will be inspected by an Authorised Officer of the Council, prior to the issue of any Street Trading Consents, where this is reasonably practicable. The unit to be used for the street trading activity shall comply in all respects to the legal requirements relating to the type of street trading activity proposed. In particular the unit to be used shall comply with the following legislation:

- Food Premises (Registration) Regulations 1991
- Food Safety Act 1990
- Food Safety (General Food Hygiene) Regulations 1995
- Health and Safety at Work etc. Act 1974 and any Regulations made under this Act
- Environmental Protection Act 1990.
- The Road Vehicles (Construction and Use Regulations) 1986

8. ISSUE OF STREET TRADING CONSENTS

8.1 Street Trading Consents are issued for a maximum of 12 months.
