LOCAL GOVERNMENT MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS ACT 1982 APPLICATION FOR A NEW STREET TRADING APPLICATION FOR KONDAL CATERING, LONDON ROAD, SLOUGH

1. <u>The Application</u>

An application for a Street Trading Consent has been submitted by Mr Inder Singh Kondal for Tasty Bunz on London Road, Langley. (**Appendix 'A')**

The application is for the sale of hot and cold food and drinks at the specified pitch between the following days and hours;

Monday to Wednesday	07:00 to 14:30
Thursday to Friday	07:00 to 14:30 and 17:30 to 23:00
Saturday	17:00 to 23:00

2. <u>Background</u>

- 2.1 In February 2011 the Licensing Committee recommended changes to the Council's Street Trading Protocol and Guidance. This would make all streets in Slough, Consent Streets, allowing anyone to apply for a Street Trading Consent and have it granted subject to consultation with local residents and in line with the Council's Policy.
- 2.2 On 19th April 2011, a meeting of the Full Council approved the recommendation of the Licensing Committee and made all streets within the Borough Consent Streets.
- 2.3 The whole area of London Road is subject to parking restrictions, (double yellow lines), apart from a small section of about 7 car lengths on the South side of the road, opposite number 413. It is this area that the applicant wishes to be permitted to trade from.
- 2.4 In addition, there is a cycle lane running along the length of the North side of London Road.
- 2.5 There have been no objections from the Police or any other Responsible Authority.
- 2.6 The Licensing Office has however received 9 objections from local residents and businesses, which are attached at **Appendix 'D'**

3. <u>The Sub-Committee must have regard to:</u>

- The Local Government Miscellaneous Provisions Act 1982
- Slough Borough Council Street Trading Consent Policy

- Slough Borough Council Street Trading Consent Standard Conditions.
- The Parking Restrictions in the Area
- The nature of the business e.g. product sold
- The appearance and suitability of the trading unit.
- Any other condition the members may feel necessary
- The overriding principle is that each application will be determined on its merits.

4. Human Rights Act 1998

Article 6 of the Human Rights Act 1998 applies:

Article 6 – That in the determination of civil rights and obligations everyone is entitled to a fair and public hearing within a reasonable time by an independent and impartial tribunal established by law.

5. <u>Options Available</u>

The Sub-Committee may

- 1. Grant the application with standard conditions
- 2. Grant the application with standard conditions and any other conditions members feel necessary which are reasonable and proportionate.
- 3. Refuse the application.

6. <u>Appeals</u>

Any party to the hearing may appeal against a decision of the licensing authority by giving notice to the Clerk to the Magistrates within 21 days of being notified of the decision.
