In April 2011, some LAF members attended a "cycle about slough" accompanied by Council Officers from the Integrated Transport Team. The resulting report highlighted problem areas within the existing cycling infrastructure/network and was discussed at the subsequent meeting. Recommendations/advice were then issued via email to relevant officers for possible improvement works to be taken forward/feedback. Plans were tabled at the September LAF meeting for the Chalvey One Way Experimental Scheme, a new traffic scheme aimed at alleviating congestion in a
busy part of Slough town. Emailed comments from the LAF on the designs have been forwarded to the designers and the Network Management Team Leader who are running
scheme as and when plans are released. Feedback has been received in answer to LAF members' queries about the designs and the consultation process is o
Give up to three examples where you have encountered difficulties; explain what mechanisms could be put in place to alleviate this issue:
Do you have any issues with recruitment of members from particular interest groups? Does this hinder your work in any way?
There is a difficulty in attaining the required membership level in general and the LAF tends to focus on cycling /walking infrastructure and routes within the urban environment. There is still no horse riding member of the Slough LAF, but two new members have joined who have a walking perspective. This has raised the membership level to 8.

Comments from appointing authority
The LAF has grown in strength over the last year being vocal about wanting to be consulted on walking and cycling schemes. There are plans to continue consulting the LAF on any walking and cycling schemes that arise over the coming year including those under the Local Sustainable Transport Fund. The AA wants to continue to encourage the LAF to develop it's own identity and independence from the council.

Continue working with the AA to be consulted on relevant schemes/issues and provide well balanced and useful advice. Develop specific LAF work plan for 2013/14 incorporating targets.
