Scrutiny of Strategic Partnerships

Synopsis

This module will look at the potential for effective scrutiny of partnerships. Drawing on comparative examples of the scrutiny of partnerships in action it will examine the main roles that overview and scrutiny can play in relation to Local Strategic Partnerships, Local Area Agreements and identify effective outcomes from scrutiny. The module will focus on the legislative context and the new scrutiny powers arising from the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 and the new statutory LAA framework

Objectives

- Understand the main elements of the framework for strategic partnerships within which councils in England work, including LSPS and related sub-partnerships
- Understand the local arrangements of the Local Strategic Partnership
- Understand the main elements of the LAA including what has been agreed locally
- Understand and put into practice the main roles that overview and scrutiny can play in relation to LSPs and be able to identify effective outcomes from scrutiny
