## **Chalvey Residents Parking Scheme**

On behalf of all the residents of Chalvey we appreciate the efforts made by Slough Borough Council, especially the Team Leader, Parking Services and her colleague, in assisting us to resolve the local parking dilemma, however there are a few concerns we have with the proposed scheme.

Firstly, the scheme is dividing the residents. If all of the following roads are included in the consultation: Ragstone Road, Kings Road, 160-196 Windsor Road, College Avenue, Martin Road, The Crescent and Chalvey Road East -North and South sides. We propose there should be one zone which encompasses all of these roads instead of splitting the roads into smaller parking zones.

Secondly, the scheme only allows for one permit per household, whereas previous proposed schemes allowed for two permits per household and a third permit dependent on kerb capacity. We would like the scheme to revert back to this proposition with two permit availability per household and a third depending on kerb capacity.

If these conditions cannot be fulfilled then we propose the scheme be scrapped and we continue parking the way we are doing so currently, because in the long term the scheme does not fulfil the local residents' needs.

Please find this to be our amendments to the proposed Zone L parking scheme. We really appreciate the Council listening to our concerns and working with us to achieve a solution for the parking dilemma. Please find below the signatures of the residents of Chalvey in the proposed Parking Scheme Zone (L) who are in approval of the above amendments made to have one inclusive Zone for Chalvey and a minimum of two permits per household, or to scrap the parking permit scheme:
