## **Paper Petition Details**

## Public Footpath Obstruction at 111 & 161 Tamar Way

Keeping waste bins on pavement on a permanent basis is blocking access for pedestrians. These bins are kept in the definitive path of a pedestrian. Occupying the limited space in the pavement for bins and car is leading to safety issues and in these two properties, the pavement access is fully blocked to the public. We are using this pavement daily to reach Tesco, Pharmacy, schools, GP, and other essential services. Residents, especially elderly and children are affected by this inconsiderate action by residents of 111 Tamar Way and 161 Tamar Way. Unobstructed pavement access is required for this neighbourhood.

We request the Council to take necessary action to stop this activity by issuing notices to 111 Tamar Way and 161 Tamar Way advising them to keep bins within curtilage except for bin collection purposes as advised by the Council policy and to protect the rights of the public. We believe that this action will ensure the safe use and enjoyment of the highway.
