#### **Joint Integrated Care Plan Outcomes work Update**

1. **Purpose of Report**

To provide an update on progress of the work in progress to enable the Wellbeing Board to measure the outcomes for the Slough Integrated Health and Care Plan.

3. **The Slough Joint Wellbeing Strategy, the JSNA and the Five Year Plan**

This programme aims to meet the overarching ambition within Slough Wellbeing strategy to increase life expectancy in our populations, reduce health inequalities and to further improve and further integrate our services to support integration and thus improve experience.

3a. **Slough Wellbeing Strategy Priorities**

1. *Starting Well*

*The programme will support integrating of health, and wellbeing services to support children and families to experience a strong start in life*

2. *Integration (relating to Health & Social Care)*

*The programme will aim to deliver integration of our services physical and mental health as well as joining up with care service sot promote wellbeing*

3. *Strong, healthy and attractive neighbourhoods*

*Build on the locality work and focus this work on building the Slough central service offer- as part of our o work to build strong neighbourhoods*

4. *Workplace health*

*Promote health and wellbeing within staff across our integrated teams*

### 3b. Five Year Plan Outcomes

*The programme aims to meeting all of the outcomes stated below by promoting high quality integrated health and wellbeing services within Slough that includes building a strong community which is sustainable.*

- *Outcome 1: Slough children will grow up to be happy, healthy and successful*
- *Outcome 2: Our people will be healthier and manage their own care needs*
- *Outcome 3: Slough will be an attractive place where people choose to live, work and stay*
- *Outcome 4: Our residents will live in good quality homes*
- *Outcome 5: Slough will attract, retain and grow businesses and investment to provide opportunities for our residents*

***The Plan, however, has specific focus on Outcome 2 as it will;***

- Build on the work of the Slough Better Care Fund, to increase the contributions from health and social care to the pooled budget.
- Encourage health and social care partners to work together to support and maintain providers, and promote the use of collaborative commissioning of services in Slough.
- Continue to work with our care users to ensure that co-production and co-design are at the heart of all that we do.
- Work to reduce the impact of COVID-19 on the physical and mental health of people in Slough.

## **4. Background**

During 2020 the Health and Wellbeing Board signed off the joint Health and Care Integrated Care Plan which brought together the ambitions and priorities across Health and Care Providers, SBC and the CCG. The Plan sets out a shared mandate to improve the health outcomes of the population through working more strongly together. The principles set out in the Plan are set out below. Members of the health and Wellbeing Board will be familiar with the plan which has been discussed at previous board meetings.

### **4a Principles aligned to our Health and Care Plan**

**FUNDING** Seek opportunities to expand pooled funding beyond the current BCF commitments.

#### **CO-PRODUCTION**

Co-production and co-design with people who use services and their family carers as core principle of how we will do all commissioning work

#### **BUILD ON EXISTING MODELS**

Where possible build on and utilise existing infrastructure, plans and proven approaches that are working

#### **POPULATION HEALTH**

We will take a population health approach to Slough's health and care needs, using data effectively to shape our responses

#### **JOINT GOVERNANCE**

We will work jointly to oversee and deliver this plan through the Health and Social Care Partnership Board and the Health and Wellbeing Board.

#### **WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT**

We will work together to develop and equip our Health and Care workforce to deliver in a more integrated way, with new post-pandemic ways of working

5. An important part of the shared ambition is to come together to agree a set of outcomes that will measure the social impact of our shared efforts. To this end Frimley CCG has commissioned HACT (The Housing Association Charitable Trust) to work with us to host a workshop in February to agree the outcomes and help develop our reporting mechanisms.
6. This report is requesting members to note the workshop and that an update and the outcomes of the workshop will be presented to the March Health and Wellbeing Board for discussion and agreement.
