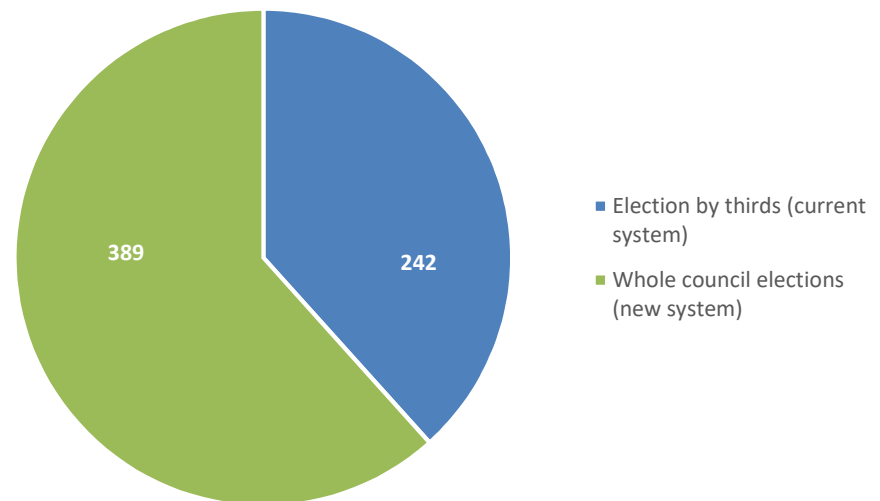


Question 1:

- **Majority support Election by thirds**

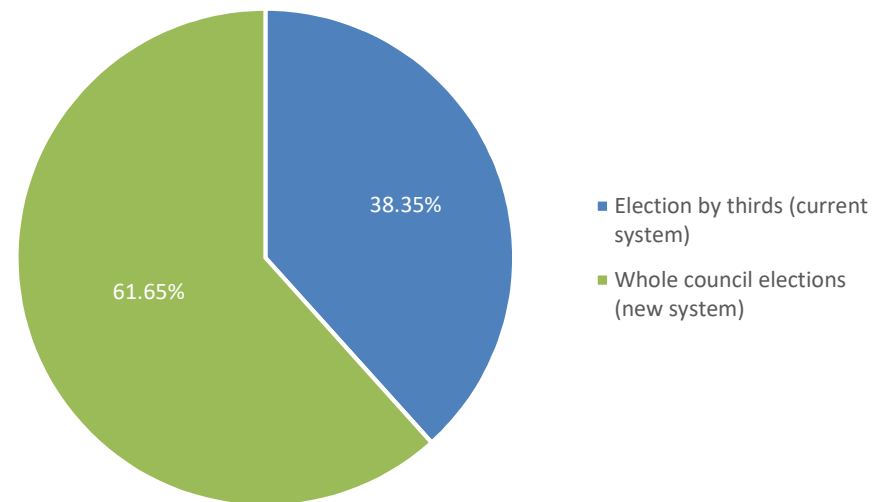
Number of Respondents

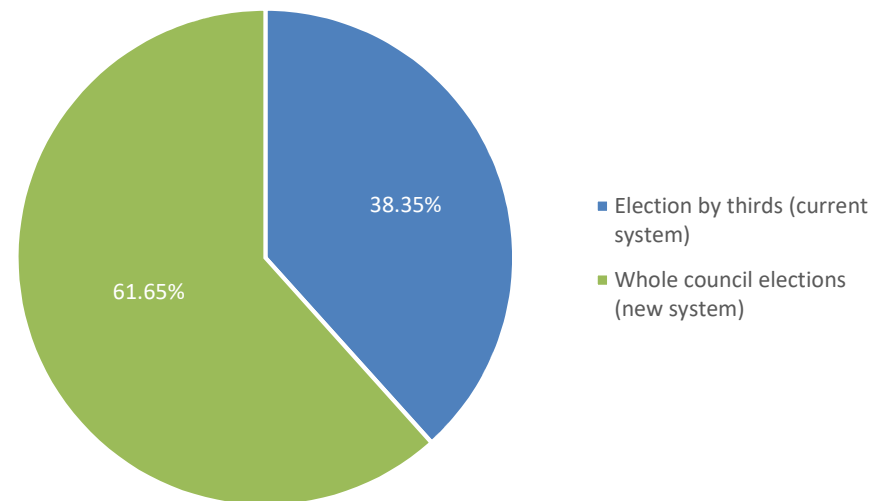
% of Election Response

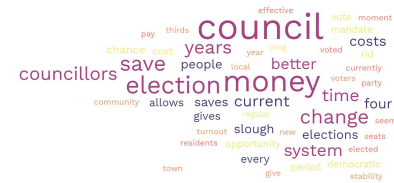
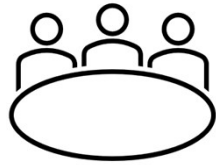


Question 2: Answers

- Source: Survey Monkey Extract 07/01/2022
- From the 631 admissible responses 287 submitted an answer
- This represents a 45.8% conversion rate of responding to this question

- Cost savings by moving to a four-year cycle
- Change cycle is more efficient if moved to a four-year cycle
- Provides a greater efficiency to planning cycle
- Provides greater transparency
- Community engagement likely to rise
- Risk of lack of rotation
- Risk is that there is a longer period of inadequacy and opportunity to address community needs
