# Bright Futures Start in Early Years

### Your child's free early years place is waiting for you today!

Research shows that children who start their education in early years achieve better GCSE results.

If you are on certain benefits such as Universal, Child Tax or Working Tax Credits and have an annual income of below £16,190 before tax (£15,400 for families in receipt of Universal Credit) you could be eligible. You could also be eligible if your child receives DLA, has an EHCP Plan or is looked after by the Local Authority.

#### Other criteria

If you're a non-UK citizen who cannot claim benefits.

If your immigration status says you have 'no recourse to public funds', you may still get free childcare for your 2-year-old. You must live in England and your household income must be no more than:

- £26,500 for families outside of London with one child
- £30,600 for families outside of London with two or more children

You cannot have more than £16,000 in savings or investments.

The easiest way to apply is online using our Citizen Portal, which you will use for all your applications for Free Early Education and School Admissions in the future.
