THE BOROUGH OF SLOUGH (PRESCRIBED ROUTES) ORDER 2022 (ORDER 21 OF 2022)

- 1. SLOUGH BOROUGH COUNCIL gives notice that on 21st April 2022 it made an Order under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and any other enabling powers.
- 2. The Order makes permanent the effects of The Borough of Slough (Prescribed Routes) (No 49) (Experimental) Order 2020 (Order 49 of 2020). The effect of the Order is to introduce a road closure for vehicles into Moat Drive, Slough for its entire length, operating between 8.00 a.m. and 9.00 a.m. and between 3.00 p.m. and 4.00 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive during school term times. During these times, no vehicle should enter, leave or proceed into Moat Drive (unless exempt).
- 3. The road closure will not apply to pedal cycles and authorised vehicles. Waivers will be issued by the Council to residents of Moat Drive and staff working at Wexham Court Primary School to authorise them to pass through the road closure whilst it is in operation. Emergency services vehicles will also be exempt from the closure.
- 4. The Order now made comes into force on 29th April 2022.
- 5. Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Act, or that any requirement of the Act or of any regulations made under the Act has not been complied with may, within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for that purpose.
