Skills for Care: Adult Social Care Workforce Data Set (ASC-WDS) demo & Workforce Development Funding information session

The Adult Social Care Workforce Data Set (ASC-WDS) helps providers manage their workforce data and provides crucial intelligence to key decision makers such as Government, DHSC, CQC and local authorities. It also gives employers access to safe and free management of staff and training records and the ability to benchmark your workplace against similar providers.

The Workforce Development Fund allows you to claim back money towards the costs of paid staff completing a broad range of adult social care qualifications, learning programmes and digital learning modules.

If you are interested to know more about ASC-WDS, are planning to update your account, haven't looked at it for a while or want to claim Workforce Development Funding this is the session for you! Capacity tracker

All providers are required to update the Capacity Tracker on a monthly basis, otherwise there is a risk of being fined. Please make use of the support available via the Contact Centre on 0191 6913729 or drop them an email via <u>necsu.capacitytracker@nhs.net</u>. There is training available to providers on the Resource page of their <u>website</u>.

Both care home residents and social care staff will be offered Covid-19 and flu vaccinations and as with previous campaigns and in line <u>with the Formal Notice</u>, vaccination data will form part of the mandated collection. This will be the same fields as in previous years. Due to the dates the campaigns start, the first reporting window for this data will be 8 October 2023 to 16 October 2023. It is especially useful for care home managers to update CT immediately following a vaccination team visit.

We encourage all residents and staff to take up their autumn COVID-19 and flu vaccine. Eligible individuals can book and manage their <u>COVID-19</u> - and <u>flu</u> - vaccination appointments online when the service becomes available.

Advocacy service in Slough

The Advocacy service, delivered by Matrix, is commissioned to provide advocacy services across Slough. Matrix have a history of working in Slough that dates back to 2007.

Advocacy is for people who have difficulties getting their voice heard due to impairments, social care needs, and having no other independent person to assist them. Typically, the person instructs the advocate themselves. However, if the person lacks capacity around a particular decision and/or process, an advocate can also be appointed in the person's best interest. There are various advocacy provisions depending on the issue.

Do you come into contact with unpaid carers? Their views matter to us!

Slough Borough Council has written to unpaid carers who received a service from Adult Social Care, inviting them to take part in the national Survey of Adult Carers in England, and letters will be arriving in the first two weeks of October. This survey is being carried out on behalf of NHS Digital.

If someone you work with is contacted, please encourage them to complete the survey so we can hear their views about the services they receive. This information is very important as it will be used to help improve Adult Social Care support.

All information will be treated in confidence. The survey closes on 30 November
