## Inaugural Meeting – 9<sup>th</sup> May 2024

## **Easy Read Minutes**



Welcome and introductions.

- The meeting started a bit late and GDM apologised for this.
- GDM said it was great to see many people with autism in attendance and many carers.
- GDM also welcomed all professionals attending the meeting.
- Some people were online and others were in the room
- Everyone said hello and shared a bit about themselves with the person next to them and all the others.



The Autism Steering Group – Presentation

- GDM shared a presentation about what the Autism Steering Group does and some basic rules like "no jargon".
- Some participants said that the meetings and the group should not involve so many professional and only reflect the views of autistic people.

Actions: GDM to reduce professional involvement and improve autistic participation.



The Autism Steering Group – Reasonable Adjustment Flag, Self-referral, and dynamic register (Presentation)

- A representative from the Frimley Integrated Care Board (NHS) was invited to present some new nation-wide initiatives. These are:
- A document that people can use to request adaptation when attending medical appointments.
- A register that aims to ensure people receive the right support at the right time by pulling together information from several different agencies.
- The possibility to refer themselves for health an social care assessments online.

 This presentation was highly welcome by participants who showed significant interest in the reasonable adjustment documents and how to access this.

# Actions: GDM to share the presentation slides with the group.



- The Group discussed the topics that are relevant to inform the work that needs to be done. These are:
- Raising awareness about autism / neuro diversity
- Need more support for people to "Learn to cope"
- Ambition to making Slough 'autism friendly' town
- Want long lasting support beyond any funding
- Need to ensure good signposting for people with autism
- Data about numbers of people with autism
- Dedicated staff within MH services with knowledge and understanding of neuro – diversity

- Timely diagnostic assessments "a diagnosis can be life changing"
- Small task groups needed to support action
- Need to develop a series of training for health professional

The Group also discussed what actions are to be taken:

- What is out there currently to support neurodiverse people? (Both information and support)
- Travel Support
- Accessing health appointments ( GP appointments being the focus)
- Diagnostic assessments long waiting lists
- Peer awareness training for staff required
- Lack of social group for neuro- diverse people
- Explore autism Hub
- Resources for young people

#### The Autism Steering Group – Other presentations

- Two more presentations were given on the day.
- Slough CVS presented the #OneSlough Fund opportunities.
  Community groups can apply for grants to run their activities.
- Based on the income they have received the previous year, they can apply for specific grants.
- The second presentation was about Art Beyond Belief, an organization that uses Art and the therapeutic benefit of Arts to support neurodivergent people.

# Actions: GDM to share the presentations with the group.

#### The Autism Steering Group – Participants feedback.

- Lots of energy and ideas in the room
- The group was very large to make decisions
- Need to consider having a smaller group with less professionals
- Need to agree where to start/focus from the 8 themes
- The group needs specific work streams working on the themes / priorities
- Arranging a smaller meeting with people with autism ASAP to ensure voices heard

• Need to ensure that meetings don't slip into using jargon



- Sending notes to all participants.
- Creation of online survey for members to decide which working group to join (optional).
- Regular "café style" events with neurodivergent people ASAP to ensure voices heard.
- Setting up the 8 "task and finish" groups / book first meeting (post survey).
