## **CQC** Inspection

Updates provided by David Coleman-Groom – Director of adult social services. The CQC completed inspection for the council in March, the inspectors will collate evidence from all participants. A draft report is expected in May.

The inspectors provided positive feedback highlighting the strength-based approach to service provision, integration of the Coproduction Network (CPN) within the Adult Social Care.

### How CQC rate services:

The CQC provides four overall ratings for health and social care services:

- Outstanding: This indicates that service is performing exceptionally well.
- Good: Indicates that the service is performing well and meeting expectations.
- **Requires Improvement:** The service is not performing as well as it should and needs to improve.
- Inadequate: The service is performing badly, and action has to be taken against the provider

Additionally, the CQC gives percentage scores to indicate whether a service is at the upper or lower end of a rating:
