



## **Coproduction Online Meeting Notes 14<sup>th</sup> October 2025**

### **Agendas**

#### **1. Extra-Care, Care and Support services – Vicky Tutty**

Vicky provided an update on extra care commissioning and said the following. Due to rapid developments, the original plan to engage the network in the focus group to design service specification has been paused, to ensure alignment with residents needs we have held engagements with residents and sent survey to families to inform service specification for the care and support services.

#### **2. Public Health - Joint Strategic Needs Assessment – Carol Hounsell**

Carol introduced the Joint Strategic Needs Assessment (JSNA), which collects data in Slough to inform service planning focussed on reducing inequalities. Topics include mental health, housing, transport, and access to services.

### **Two requests were made to the Co-production Network:**

1. Provide feedback on JSNA materials.
2. Nominate a member to join the JSNA Steering Group.

The Co-production network emphasised on long-term collaboration and shaping services with lived experience. Concerns were raised about digital exclusion, transport barriers, and community awareness. Suggestions included making JSNA information the homepage on library computers and improving outreach to digitally disconnected communities.

## **Outcome**

A member of co-production joined the JSNA steering group

### **3. One Slough Funding Allocation Updates – James Parker**

James shared that the fund supports community groups delivering health and wellbeing projects. A record 49 applications were received, with 30 groups funded. Priorities include health inequalities, community cohesion, and children & young people. Funding tiers are £3,000, £5,000, and £10,000, with smaller grassroots groups prioritised. Groups are encouraged to register on the Slough Community Directory. Guidance documents and project summaries are available via Slough CVS.

### **4. Older People's Day Feedback – Marcia Wright & Bestina Bukori**

The event was held on 1 October 2025 with 48 attendees. Key issues raised included digital exclusion, parking payment barriers, care costs, housing concerns, library opening times, and redevelopment of Queensmere and Observatory. The panel included Council leadership and public health representatives. Feedback was positive, with emphasis on direct engagement.

A proposal was made to hold the November meeting online and December meeting in person due to its proximity to Christmas. Attendees agreed, and suggestions included festive elements such as mince pies.
